## Tim Myers shines in golf tourney

"My goal is to join the pro golf tour before I reach the age of 20," declared Tim Myers, state golf co-champion.

**TIM PLAYED** in the Oregon High School Golf Tournament on May 18 and 19, as Grant's only entrant and finished deadlocked with Jeff McRae, of McNary, for medalist honors. Both boys turned in five-under par, 143 totals for their 36 holes of golf at Glendover's east course.

"Jeff really gave it his all and he is a dandy little golfer," Tim smugly stated.

**DURING THE** first day's action, "T," as he is known among friends, hit the ball well but putted poorly in his first nine holes of golf. He finished the front nine with two birdies and one bogey to his credit.

Tim played his best golf on the back nine of the first day. He began by sinking a 20-foot birdie putt and, after paring the next three holes, the senior recorded another birdie. This came about after he hit a beautiful wedge

shot to within three feet of the cup and holed the ensuing putt.

**TIM PARRED** the next two holes, "when I (Myers) should have birdied them." On the 585-yard, par 5 17th hole, Tim hit a 280-yard drive and put his second shot 15 feet short of the green. He chipped in from there for a spectacular eagle three. Tim finishes the first day's action with a birdie on the 18th hole, after driving his tee shot onto the green. This left him with a six-under par total of 68, one stroke behind McRae, the leader.

On the second day, Myers started out slow, but then made a spirited charge in the Arnold

Palmer tradition, with three birdies on the final nine to end up tied with McRae for the individual championship.

Lending a helpful hand was James Lyons, who knowledgeably served as Tim's caddy. Besides helping with club selection, he added encouragement.

"I was confident 'T' would get it going, 'cause he never gives it the choke action. I can hardly wait until he goes on the pro tour," James expounded.

"T" is currently contemplating enrolling at the University of Houston, a school famous for its golf program. I would like to go, also, as his caddy," James concluded.

## Spikers win city title in runaway; look tough for upcoming state meet

Securing 12 spots for the State meet, taking place at Eugene tomorrow and Saturday, the Generals rolled to an easy city track championship last Saturday at Madison. A total of 124 points were amassed.

Scott Jackson and Greg Schukart each qualified for two events. Scott was the mile winner and placed second, behind teammate Don Johnson, in the two-mile. Greg won the discus and placed fourth in the javelin.

Steve Hopkins earned a trip to the state meet with a winning, 210'6" throw in the javelin. Greg Graham ran the 100-yard dash in 10.0 and placed second. Both Steve and Greg ran on the 440

relay team, which placed second. The mile relay foursome, anchored by Mike Huffsmith, won their race in 3:26.6.

Glenn Ross, a sophomore, high jumped 6'2" to earn a berth at state. Wilson Walker was the city champion in the long jump at 21'9 1/2". Despite placing fourth in the high hurdles, Steve Rooney's time of 15.1 seconds was good enough for state.

John Mears will run on both relay teams. He will be joined on the mile combo by Robert Usselman, Richard Rosenbloom, and Huffsmith. Other members of the 440 relay squad include Billy Bates, Hopkins, and Graham.


