wanted," said Dick Andrews, member of the CCC faculty senate, "This year the board again rejected the factfinders report, but 5 percentage points away from faculty demands. If we accept less this year, we'll have to go through this year after year."

"We want the board to bargain in good faith and to pay attention to the factfinders report that the faculty paid for and they (the board) requested," said Andrews. According to Andrews, when the faculty

According to Andrews, when the faculty phoned the board's lawyer, Mike Montgomery, and told him of their decision, to accept the factfinders report, he hung up on them saying that in that case they had nothing to talk about. Montgomery then went on television and said the faculty refused to talk to him.

"The board sees us (faculty) as a very ex-

pendable and not very useful tool in the education process," said Andrews. "But what they're really playing with is you (the students)."

According to Andrews if the faculty doesn't get what they want, they won't teach as well

"If the morale is at rock bottom, instructors won't teach as well," said Andrews. "What really bothers me is that students are coming out on the short end."

"Striking for most of them (faculty) is the very last thing they'd want to do," said Cressler. "But they'll do it if they have to."

"What I would personally like to see is that students, faculty and support staff bring pressure so no strike occurs," said Andrews.
