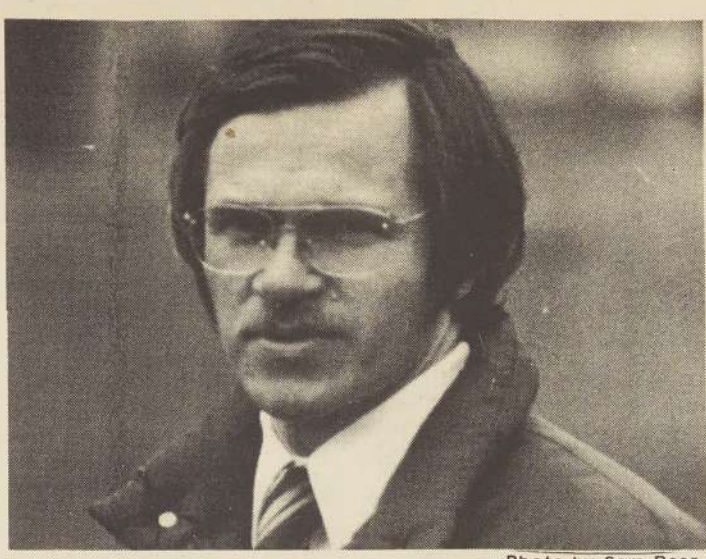


DeNoon joins Smith in track coaching duties

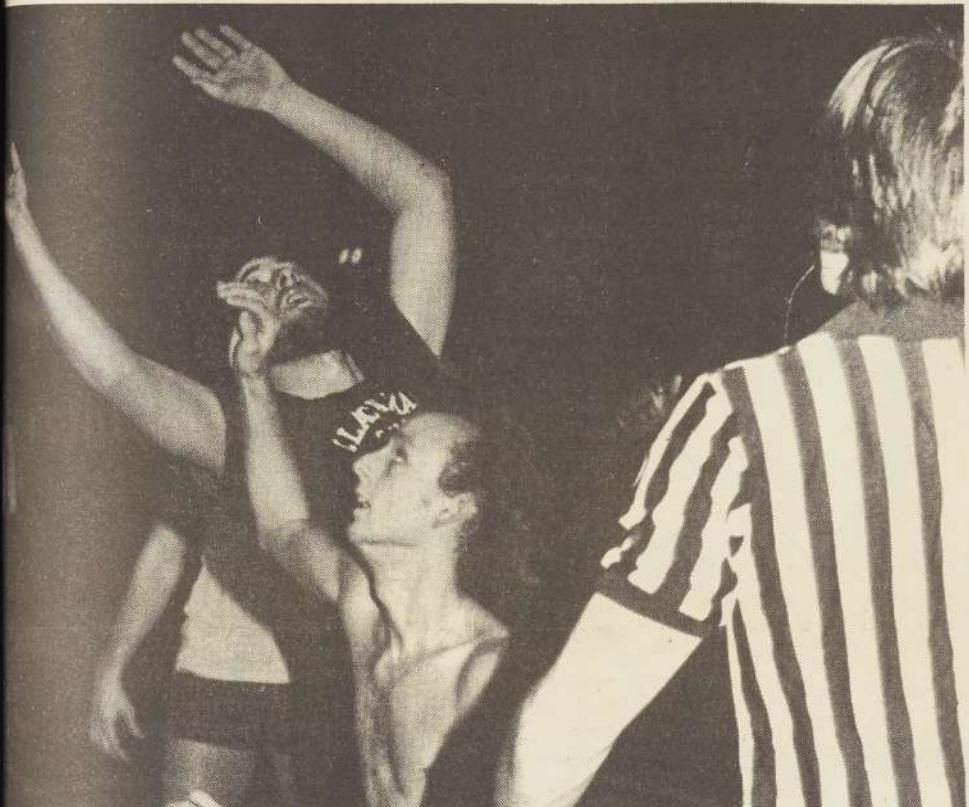

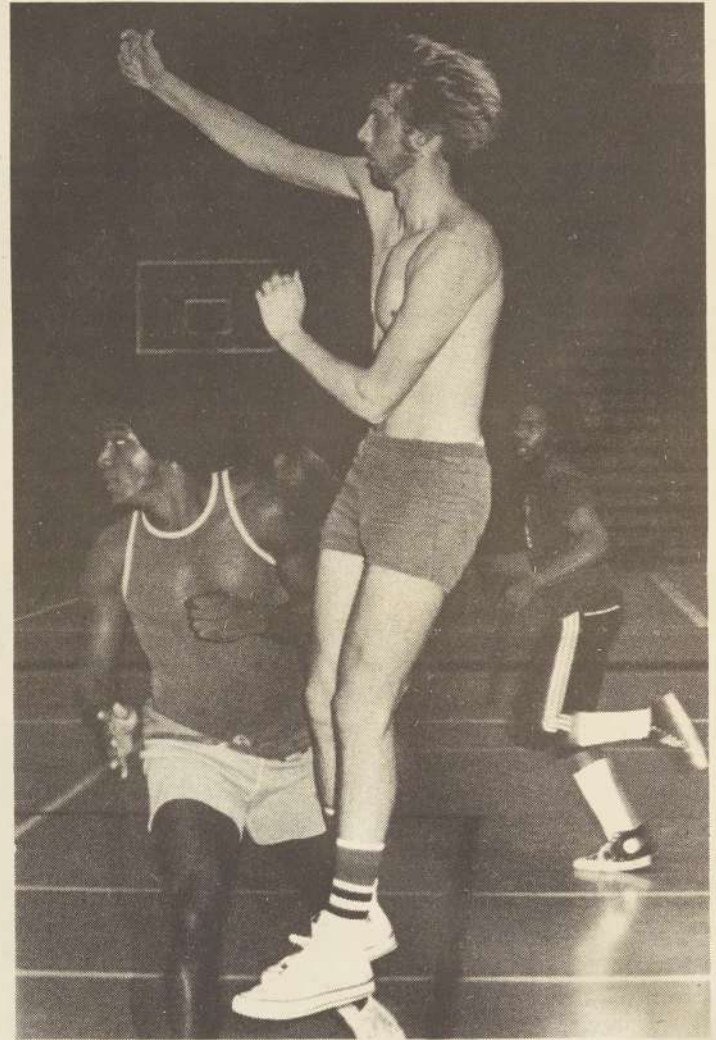
Donald DeNoon . . . new assistant women's track coach.

Women find no comfort in losses. The College women's basketball team dropped games last week to Willamette University and Clackamas Community College. Against Willamette in a game marked their first home game, the Cougars played tough defense and held the half, 27-21. However the Willamette team proved to be too strong for the Cougars as they took advantage of the Cougars' 49 turnovers to win the game. The Cougar defense was hurt by the fact that guard Cindy Patrick and center Erin Gamble were still plagued by injuries. The Cougars missed which helped Willamette's ability to score 20 more shots than the Cougars. Center Jan Buse had 17 rebounds and 16 points and Tammy White added 13 points and 12 rebounds. Despite being limited in her playing time, had 5 rebounds and 3 assists. Against Umpqua on Friday night, Jan. 19, Clackamas got in trouble early and were never able to get in the game as they lost the first half alone, Clackamas had 27 fouls to Umpqua's 12.
