"I have never really had any problem because I have never pre-registered. It is a lot smoother than PCC," Arlen Phillips said.

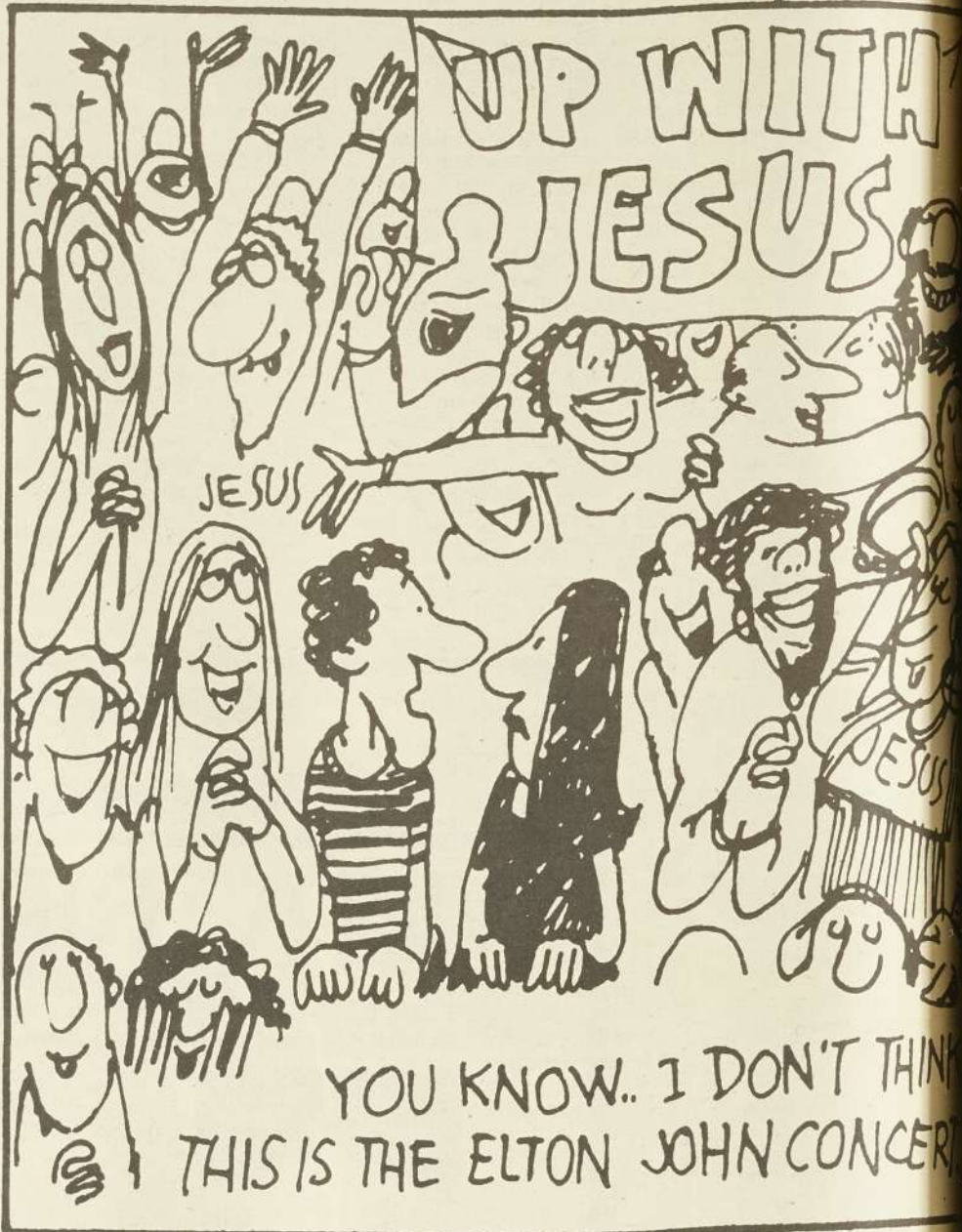
