The men's tennis team suffered both ups and downs in their play last week. Clackamas won against Judson Baptist and Concordia but lost to Mt. Hood, Multnomah School of Bible, and Chemeketa.

Friday they suffered a 4-2 setback by Chemeketa. Mike Maynard, Clackamas, won his sets 6-2, 6-3. Buddy Patnode, Dave Riggs, Sam Picken, Duane Wiegand, and Phil Rider lost their matches, however.

In doubles action Maynard and Patnode combined for a 6-2, 2-6, 6-3 win. Riggs and Picken did not fare as well losing 3-6, 0-6, and 1-6, 1-2, respectively.

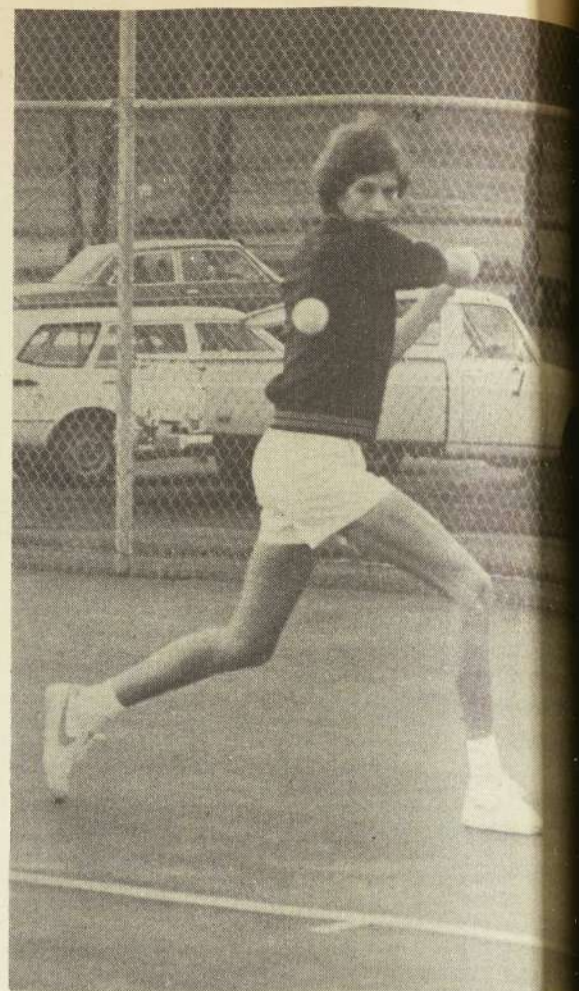
Golfers drop two

Bolliger and Jackson continue to up records

Clackamas men's track team has been plagued with injuries but on Friday they showed defending champion, Lane, that they could win regardless.

Both teams were minus members in the competition held at Clackamas. The Cougars emerged with 166 points compared to Lane's 152. Randy Bolliger and Dan Jackson recorded new school records and Preston Martin a personal best.

Bolliger put the shot 52-4 to up his old record and take that competition. Jackson finished second to Bolliger in the shot but set a discus record of 155-10½ with Bolliger in third with 124.

Preston Martin cleared 6-3¾ for a personal best. Right behind him was Dave Grosnickle also at that height but with more misses. "Preston had a super day. He has a back injury but he came right through the pain and performed well," Les Tipton, head coach, said.

"This was not really a true

test for either school." Tipton said. "Our people did a good job and it doesn't berate them all the competitors weren't there."

"We had a couple of people out, for instance, Doug Oberst who would have won the steeplechase. Lane was missing Magness and Martin, two of their top performers," he said.

Kelly Britz outdistances his competitors easily in the 880 with a time of 1:56.1. Britz was also part of the winning mile relay team. Dave Rudishauser, Keith Self, and Don Brown along with Britz turned in a 3:30.2 for the win over Lane.

"Britz is really coming back to being the old Kelly," Tipton said. "He has had the flu and he's just starting to look like his old self again."

"Don Brown is another one coming off an injury. He is maturing and was, I think capable of winning the mile," Tipton said.

Brown took second in the mile with a 4:10.4 just three tenths of a second behind Lane's

Mick Palius. At the 1500 meter he was just two seconds away from the national qualifying standard.

The sprinters encountered some trouble in the 440-yard relay. Steve Maynard started them out in the lead and Joe Jones kept them there but just after the handoff in the third leg Randy Shoffen fell leaving Clackamas with no hope of winning the race.

Joe Jones and Maynard made up for their trouble in the relay with a first and third in the 100-yard dash. Jones was clocked at 10.0 and Maynard at 10.4.

Jones tripled with his jump of 21-½ to win the high jump and decathlete Mark Nugen took third at 19-9 ¾. Nugen took second in a two-man 120-yard high hurdle race in 17.5, second in the pole vault behind Dave Grosnickle who won at 13-0, and third in a Clackamas sweep of the javelin.

Mike Murphy took the javelin competition at 180-9¼, Curt Lowery was second with 167-9, Nugen third with 166-11 ¾, and

Larry Heller fourth with a throw of 166-1½.

"Mike Murphy can throw the javelin in the 200 range," Tipton said. "He's just starting to get back into competition. Ed McCallister started his season with a 58.2 in the 440-yard intermediate hurdles and I think he shows great potential." Keith Self and Tony Terry finished third and fourth in that race behind McCallister's second.

In the 440-yard dash Rudishauser took third with a 51.3 while Jones ran a 23.4 in the 220-yard dash also for third.

Triple jumper Dave Reed who last year qualified for the Nationals could not collect himself against Lane's Mike Yeoman. Reed jumped 44-8½ for second. His best mark is 45-7.

Eric Holmstrom scored second place points in the three-mile with a 16:04.8 behind Scott Spruill of Lane. The steeplechase was not held.

Three people have qualified for Nationals so far. Just going to the competition discus, Bolliger in the shot, Mark Nugen in the decathlon.

"This week Doug Oberst be entered in the steeplechase and I think he can qualify the Nationals. He's had practice for two weeks but he had a beautiful race in practice," Tipton said. "It will be fun to see how many of our people qualify."
