Enrollment management receives executive nod

unanimous decision, the Board of Education approved a \$50,000 expenditure for a new enrollment management department during their regular meeting on April 12.

The expenditure will cover the salary of a full-time enrollment manager and staff appointments for community and student activities, publication media, and registration media and registration.

"The main thrust behind going with a four-day work week is to conserve energy," said Howard Fryett, assistant to the president.

In other business the board approved:

-- hiring of Tsuyoshi Inouye as data processing officer, to fill a vacancy in that position.

-- authorization of the purchase of three additional automatic doors for the sum of \$5,651.

-- a formal expression of the boards appreciation of the work of the Finance Study Committee, chaired by Dan Faddis, and that of the Citizens' Election Steering Committee, chaired by Ben Hansen, in the success of the rate-based serial levy election, April 4.

-- annual application for funding of the college's adult education programs.

-- award of bid to IBM for one memory typewriter for instructional use, for the sum of \$5,260.

-- to pay selected full-time faculty who will be teaching summer session at the daily rate of the current year's salary, i.e.,

the 1978 summer session salary will be a daily rate for each individual based on the 1977-78 salary schedule. The full daily rate is to be based on a full load and the hours put in per week are to be the same as during the regular school year.

The board also set May 5 and 6 as dates for a board workshop staff development.
