

Candidates offer views of finances, procedure

ful despite a limited knowledge of parliamentary procedure. Harlan said the ASG makes a poor student advocate and that if he were elected he would work to increase the amount and quality of student representation.

This would mean more active interaction between the vice president and the senate, he said. The role would be particularly important to committee situations where strong representation is a must, Harlan said.

Harlan feels the experience of the senate plus his proven ability to get along with the members of that body will make him the best choice for ASG Vice President.

Dave Riggs has been active in student government since he was a freshman in high school. Riggs said that he understands and is prepared to take on the responsibilities of senate parliamentarian. Riggs is a recently-elected member of the student senate.

The candidate emphasized that it is not enough for the vice president to sit in meetings and preside as merely the parliamentarian. Realizing that strict rules do not always make for the clearest goals, Riggs sees the vice president as having to moderate discussions with the idea of promoting understanding between the members of the senate and the members of the faculty and the student body.

New ideas should be thought out and made clear to the senate body by the vice presidency, Harlan said.

ASG is doing an "incredible

job" of presenting programs that promote interests outside the general scope that the school offers, according to Riggs. He advocates the continuance and promotion of more of these programs for next year. Riggs feels that his ideas and interest give him the leadership ability to be a fine ASG officer.

Practical background experience in business related activities highlights this year's candidates for student government business manager.

Maureen Kearney, incumbent, said that she knows exactly what her job requirements are after being business manager this past

Secondly, Kearney said that she would like to instigate a student awareness program as to what exactly student government is and what things in general they have done and are doing for the students academically and recreationally.

A business major, Kearney has a "large political background" and has completed

three years of accounting along with practical accounting experience with various affiliations.

Kearney is presently involved with CCOSAC and has spent a great deal of her time working with this program.

Sherrie Montgomery is a business major at the College and wants to be A S G Business Manager because she wants to get involved in student government and feels that with her past experience she can best serve the students in this role.

Montgomery has developed and implemented programs at the Albina alternative school in Portland where she was directly involved in leadership and management.

During her eight years in the business world she has written budget proposals dealing with millions of dollars and has been in charge of the day-to-day disbursement of these funds.

Montgomery would also like to see more involvement from students at this college.

"There are students here that don't even know there is a student government much less that there going to be elections," she said. "I know something has to be done to get more students involved but I don't feel like I can make any definite suggestions right now."

To begin with, Montgomery wants to concentrate her time and energy in doing the best job she can as business manager and then she intends to get involved in other areas that concern students, she said.
