days a week, he says that he reached his peak at the age of nine.

White received his Doctorate in poolology from Notre Dame; he has a Ph.D from Fort Hayes at Kansas State; a Bachelor of Science from Utah State and a Bachelor of Science from the University of Alabama. White says that he cannot get any better than he now is. It's easy to believe as he pockets six balls with one shot.

White has played pool all over the world. He has visited 126 countries, 226 schools and has appeared on television, military bases and in department stores.

White became world champion in 1926 when he beat Willie Mosconi, "who hasn't talked to me since," he said.
