The possibility of a new student lounge to replace the current smoking table on the second floor in McLoughlin Hall was discussed at the Associated Student Government meeting Thursday, Nov. 9. The table in McLoughlin Hall has been declared a fire hazard.

ASG president, Mike McCarty appointed ASG Media

Coordinator Happie Thacker to head a committee to research the possibility of a new location in another area. The major concern was that of finding a place for College students over 30 who regularly use the smoking table a new location of their own.

According to Lisa Thomas, ASG senator, the decision concerning the possibility of

establishing a student lounge in place of the smoking table has been tabled until this Thursday's meeting.

"We agreed to hold this issue until next Thursday so that we can first form a special committee and then make our decision from that point," she said.

"Many of us are supporting this issue but we still need the people to form the committee so that we can look a little more in depth to the situation."

Senators were informed that they would receive questionnaires to have answered on an individual basis by students. Each senator will receive 10 to 15 forms that

they are to ask the questions from to various students on a one-to-one situation. The

questions will concern students' answers about college activities.

Dietician available

A free dietician service is being offered at the College for persons who have special dietary problems.

Mickie Namura, a registered dietician, is on campus in the Community Center, room 116, Wednesdays from 9 a.m. to noon and in Barlow Hall, room 202F from noon to 1 p.m. to discuss problems with diets to students.

"The program is primarily aimed at parents and preschoolers and infants," said

Sandra Zimmer, coordinator of consumer and homemaking grants at the College. "But, Mickie will also talk to persons who have problems with diabetes, food allergies, or if they don't understand specific diets for weight-loss or weight-gain."

"If the program is successful this term, we will offer it again next term," Zimmer said.

Counseling to self evaluate

The counseling department has recently conducted a survey to assess the career counseling needs of students attending the College. Results of the study indicated that the majority of college students are most interested in learning ways to locate jobs, and current information on the job market and employment trends, according to Bernie Nolan, College counselor.

In the individual studies it was found that women returning to school are interested in learning to do a self-assessment

of interests, abilities, and values. Guided studies students (PSY 142) are most interested in vocational information about training available at the College. Nolan, of Career Counseling, was in charge of the survey.

"The main thing we found from the survey is that different people have different needs," Nolan said.

The survey will assist the counseling department in making improvements providing current job information and vocational displays at the College.

Diplomas subject of meeting

The possibility of high school diplomas being earned at Clackamas Community College, was discussed at the College board meeting Nov. 8.

A new policy was adopted at the Wednesday night meeting, which makes it possible for adults, who lack a high school diploma, to earn one on the

basis of their competence and experience.

In other board action, the rescension of a bid for asphalt work to the Rabbit Blacktop paving Company, took place, because they did not perform the job. The work was awarded to the Cascade Road and Driveway Company. Their bid was \$5,886.40.

Martha Baish was appointed coordinator of continuing education, at the college, and Bob Cody, of Estacada, was named to the college budget committee.

Board members also agreed to send a letter supporting the expansion of Dwyer Memorial Hospital.

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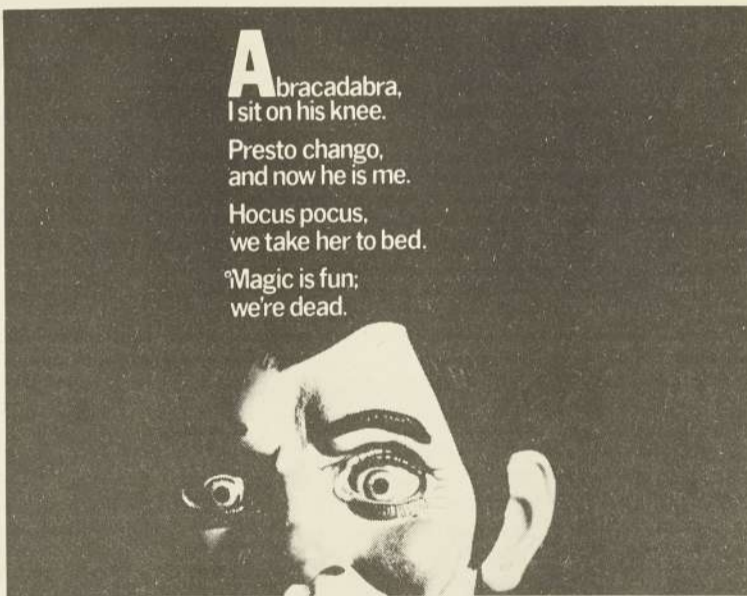
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
