4-H live judging

The Clackamas County 4-H livestock judging competition will be held in Canby at the county fairgrounds on April 21.

Managing this year's contest will be the Clackamas Community College Ag Business Club and the College agriculture department. From this contest the top 10 individuals will be divided into two teams.

These judges will represent Clackamas County at the State Fair and Pacific International.

The bulk of the tournament will consist of evaluating two classes of beef, swine and sheep plus categories of meat and feed identification, a class of hay and one of oral reasons. The CCC Livestock Judging

Team will be scoring the 4-Hers' oral reasons as well as serving as official judges for the other divisions. All 4-H members of Clackamas County are eligible to attend.
