

Counselor Evans honored by Board

Bernice Evans, College counselor and originator of the Focus on Women program,

was one of three persons who received certificates of achievement at the March 14

meeting of the College Board of Education.

Also recognized were Kit

Youngren, director of the Gladstone Community School program, and Marjorie Bradley

of Molalla, who has been active in many programs for senior citizens.

Evans was recognized for her leadership in originating and developing the Focus on Women program at the College. The program, which she headed until recently, has received national attention and helped lead to the development of the Men's Resource program.

Youngren was recognized for outstanding service in developing college programs and services in the Gladstone community since 1972, and for establishing an exemplary program of district-city-college cooperation. Youngren was recently named Oregon Community Educator of the year.

Bradley was honored as being an inspiration to senior citizens of Molalla and throughout the county for her work with Loaves and Fishes.
