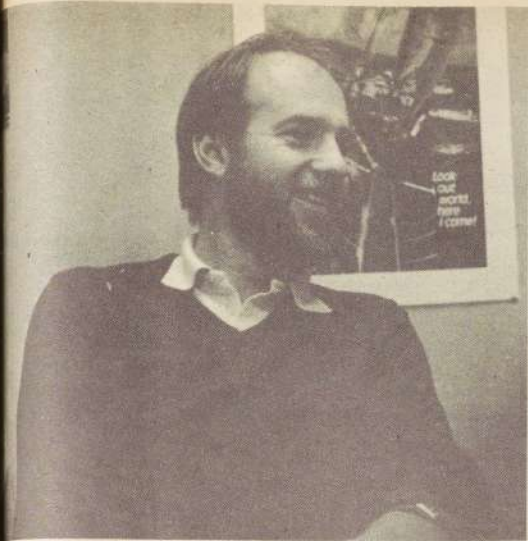




FRANK HARLOW—Frank Harlow, speech coach looks back on 1978-79 season.

Speakers win trophies, more at tournaments

The College speech team will wrap up a successful third season by competing in a

statewide tournament at Portland Community College this weekend.

The team will be competing against the rest of the community college in the state as well as colleges from Washington for the state and regional trophies.

"We did fairly well this year, brought home a lot of trophies.

But trophies aren't the real things we are out for," said speech coach Frank Harlow.

"We had some good experiences. All were good competitors and students," he said of the 12 speech team members.

"The high point of the year was me getting sick in Missoula, Mont. (at the Big Sky Tournament), and getting out of the kids' hair for two days," Harlow said. "Or maybe it was my winning the Linkel Cause Award for screwing up a ballad

I turned in at the Western Washington tournament. It's a humorous award," he added.

Prospects for the 1979-80 season look good, the coach said. "We will have 10 students returning, plus the incoming

freshmen. We will have probably 15 to 18 students, ideally 25." Harlow said some of this year's competitors are sending themselves to debate camp this summer to prepare for the upcoming year.

Getting late

Students who have accumulated enough class hours for either a certificate or an associate degree need to petition for graduation soon, according to Len Monroe, dean of student services.

Monroe said students planning to graduate at the end of the term should petition with the registrar's office or see a counselor. "To assure being able to participate in the graduation exercise, a student must file a petition. Please contact immediately," Monroe said.

Graduation ceremony is set for June 8 at 7 p.m. in Randall Hall. All students who have already submitted a petition for a certificate or an associate degree should have received a letter with all the necessary details about participating in graduation, according to Monroe. "If a student has not received a letter, he or she should contact the dean of student's office," he said.
