Building begins

The College Board of Education awarded bids totaling more than \$3.4 million for construction of the College's Linus Pauling Science Center, during a special meeting on Oct. 24.

Receiving bids on the project are: Contractors, Inc., of Tualatin, for \$1,969,000 as general contractor; Interstate Air Conditioning of Portland, for \$868,000, as mechanical contractor; Shaw-West Co., Tigard, for \$394,770, as electrical contractor; and Monitor Products, Tacoma, Wash., for \$199,741, as casework contractor.

Construction on the science building should begin in mid-November. The project is expected to be completed by fall, 1981.
