

National tourney educational for judges

The College's livestock judging team placed 17th out of 27 two-year colleges at the National Community College Livestock Judging Contest in Louisville, Ky., in November.

Clackamas totaled 3,914 points, 96 behind champion Northeastern Oklahoma.

The best individual finisher for Clackamas was Darren McFarlane, of Milwaukie, who placed seventh out of more than 120 competitors in the beef judging.

The College team finished 10th in beef judging; 13th in sheep; 16th in swine; and 17th in oral reasons. The other team members were: Reed Campbell of Canby, Sharon Kalmloch of Milwaukie, Leanna King of Molalla, and Eric Etzel of Medford.

Question asked

Students are being surveyed this week to discover their needs and interests in the area of class scheduling.

According to Kent Heaton, assistant to the dean of instruction for research and staff development, the reason for the survey is to find out "what students really want instead of what we think they want." Heaton added that this fall, classes were being filled to capacity between the hours of 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. while between 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. not many students were taking anything.

Heaton said that, "The kind of information provided by the survey will help the College plan better scheduling and use facilities in order to meet student needs better." If survey results show that students aren't interested in taking classes at certain hours, the College will offer courses that will interest a different portion of the community in order to have maximum use of college facilities throughout the day.

Heaton stressed that credit should go to student government volunteers who are responsible for running the survey. The results of the survey will be hand compiled and should be available in about two weeks.
