Reynolds tops fall sports award list

Although CCC did not field a championship team during the fall sports schedule, there were more than a handful of individual athletes who received awards of achievement during the fall.

Even though Nancy Reynolds ran the whole year alone, it was not enough to dampen her determination. Among Reynolds' accomplishments and awards for the season were, All Oregon Community College Athletic Association (OCCAA) award, a third place finish at the regional meet which gained her all regional honors, and last but certainly not least, a sixth place finish at the national cross country meet in Wichita, Kan., which earned her a place on

the All-American second team. Not bad for one season.

The soccer team had three award winners during the 1979 season. Charlie Park topped the list as the highest vote-getter among all forwards in the OISA which earned the sophomore star first team status. Midfielder Shawn O'Brien was also named to the first team squad at the midfield position as was Ken Froescher for his defensive effectiveness from the fullback position.

Rich Ferguson of the Cougs led all scorers with 24 points followed by Lower Columbia's Ron Palmer. L.C.'s Bill Dunlap had 18 while Eric Walker netted 17 in a losing effort.

The crux of the situation in the game came at the foul line where the visitors were 22/32. Comparatively the Cougs were just 7 out of 16.

The following Saturday, the cagers traveled to Pasco, Wash., and a contest with powerful Columbia Basin College. The cougs fell decisively, 105-86.

Coach Kiser noted, "We really got ripped by the officials," but added, "They might have been a little too strong and physical for us."

Columbia Basin's Don Hewston led all scorers with 35 points with Dan Alexander of CCC and Mack Harris of CBC

contributing 20 each for their respective schools.

The Cougs will travel to Longview for a re-match against Lower Columbia before competing in the Metro Tournament on Dec. 6 and 7. Monmouth will be the site of the following game on Dec. 11 against OCE's j.v. team and then will play Spokane Community College and face Linfield's j.v.'s twice before school opens up again.
