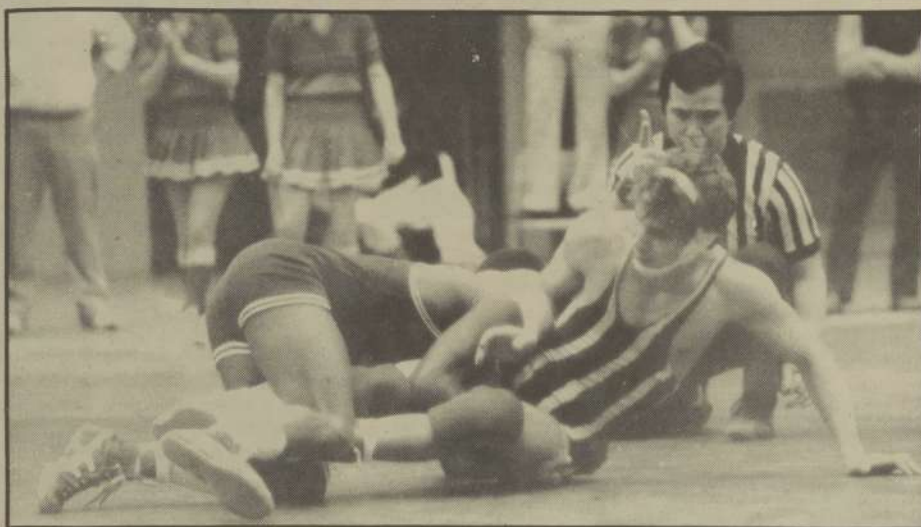


Winner, Bolf place; off to nationals

Two Cougar matmen placed in the Region 18 wrestling tournament last weekend on the home mats to qualify for national competition and aiding in a fourth place finish edging past Mt. Hood CC by one-half point.

With a 29-6 season record, Mike Bolf took second place in the 134 division after a first round default over Mike Pine of Grays Harbor. In the second round Bolf pinned Kim Sprague of Ricks College in 2:10 earning his way to finals where he went up against George Patterson of North Idaho. Bolf couldn't pull off the victory, as Patterson took a 21-9 decision over him.

At 142, Nathan Winner raised his season record to

36-1, the third highest record in Clackamas history, according to Cougar coach Norm

Berney.

Winner pinned Craig Stoecker of Southwestern Oregon CC in 1:27 during first round action and moved into the second round to take a 17-3 decision over Mt. Hood's Chuck Lumpkin. In the championship finals, Winner defeated Tony Coppinger of Grays Harbor by a 14-5 decision.

Combined efforts of these two grapplers and their teammates brought the Cougars to a one-half point victory over Mt. Hood. North Idaho took the top seat with 92½ points followed by Grays Harbor at 68, Ricks College at 61½ then fourth place Clackamas at 36¾ over Mt. Hood at 36½.

Bolf and Winner will travel to Worthington, Minnesota, March 4-6 for national competition.

"They both did a real good job," according to Berney. "I

wish the team had wrestled with the intensity that they did.

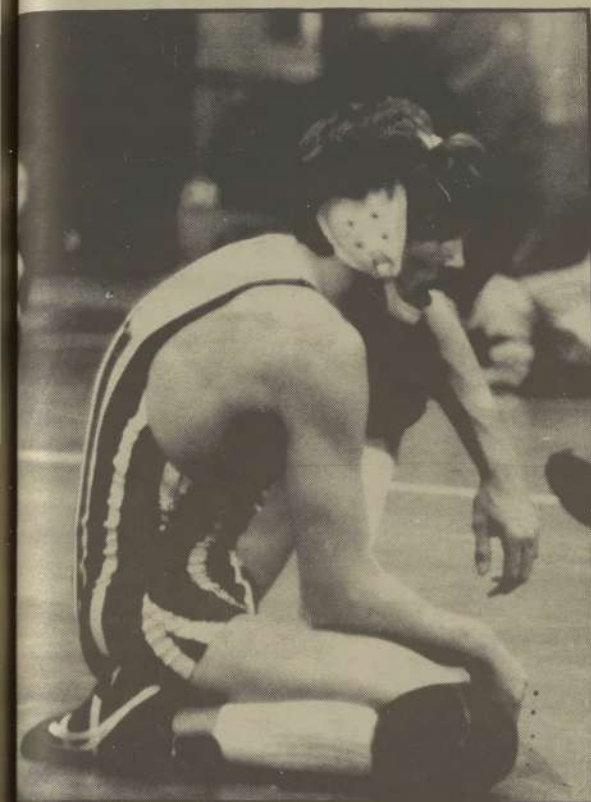
but the pressure of a Regional

Tournament didn't allow them to compete at their ability level. They allowed the competition to get to them."

Overall Berney was satisfied with the Cougar season. "It was a fairly successful season," he said. "We could have done better, but we could have done worse. Considering their experience and background they did a good job."

In order for Bolf and Winner to get anywhere at nationals, Berney said, "They'll have to work hard and wrestle well. They have to earn it because back there (Worthington) nobody gives you anything," he said. "They'll have to keep their intensity and concentrate on being in there in the end."

Berney said that if they do all of the above they have a chance of being All-American. Good luck guys!

power lifter. Another exceptional performance was by Adam Peebles, in the high school division. "It was an outstanding lift," Fiskum said, "Everyone was very impressed."
