

Women's tennis team dominates regionals

Women's tennis Coach Gladys Michael said last week that her team would have to be considered the favorite going into last weekend's Oregon Community College Athletic

Association Region 18 Tournament. Michael's predictions came to pass as the women came away with a first place finish in the tournament held at Lane CC in Eugene.

Clackamas finished the meet having won 17 matches followed by North Idaho with seven, Blue Mountain with six, Treasure Valley with four, and Chemeketa and Mt. Hood with three each. Umpqua also participated, but was unable to win a match.

Bonnie Dillman, playing the first singles spot for the Cougars, began singles play by beating Isa Woermann of Mt. Hood 6-1, 6-0; Diane Tipton of North Idaho 6-1, 6-1; and Chris Maks of Chemeketa 4-6, 7-6, 6-4 to take first in the number one spot.

Michelle Wilkins came back from her injuries to take first in the number two spot. Wilkins beat Tracy Roshau of Lane 6-2, 6-0; Lisa Allen of Treasure Valley 6-2, 6-0; and Trist Boyle of North Idaho 6-4, 7-6 to earn the victory.

Mary Imper of Clackamas made it three in a row for her team in singles action as she beat Lisa Ross of Lane 6-2, 6-3; Carla Brown of Blue

Mountain 6-1, 6-1; and Vicky Brown of North Idaho 7-6, 1-6, 6-4 for the third spot win.

Lori Dosier made the Cougars domination of singles play complete with a first place finish in the fourth spot. She won 6-2, 6-3 over Treasure Valley's Leslie Farnworth; 6-1, 6-1 over Tammy Williams of Blue Mountain and 6-1, 1-6, 7-6 over Sandy Yantes of Mt. Hood.

In doubles play, Dillman and Wilkins continued their season-long domination of their opponents as they breezed through three matches to take the number one doubles spot victory.

Lane's team of Ward and Ross was the women's first opponent and gave them little trouble in a 6-0, 6-1 win. The Maks-Minten team of Chemeketa was also an easy win, this one a 6-0, 6-0 mismatch.

The finals of the number one doubles bracket was also a cakewalk for Dillman and Wilkins, who took a 6-1, 6-0 win over North Idaho's team of Boyle and Brown.

The three doubles wins for Dillman and Wilkins gave them a combined total of nine match victories to lead the team scoring.

In second doubles action, Imper and Dosier beat the Woermann-Kirkland team of Mt. Hood to begin their play. They followed the win by beating Brown and Williams of Blue Mountain 6-2, 6-4 to set

for the team's only loss of the day.

Lisa Allen and Sue Lewis of Treasure Valley needed three sets to beat Imper and Dosier 4-6, 7-6, 6-2. Despite the win, Allen and Lewis did not qualify for Nationals competition as they were Treasure Valley's second doubles team. Only first spot teams can qualify for the Nationals apart from team scoring.

Dillman, Wilkins and Imper all earned special individual honors in last weekend's tournament as they were selected to the OCCAA Conference All-Star team. Dillman and Wilkins also earned all-region-18 honors.

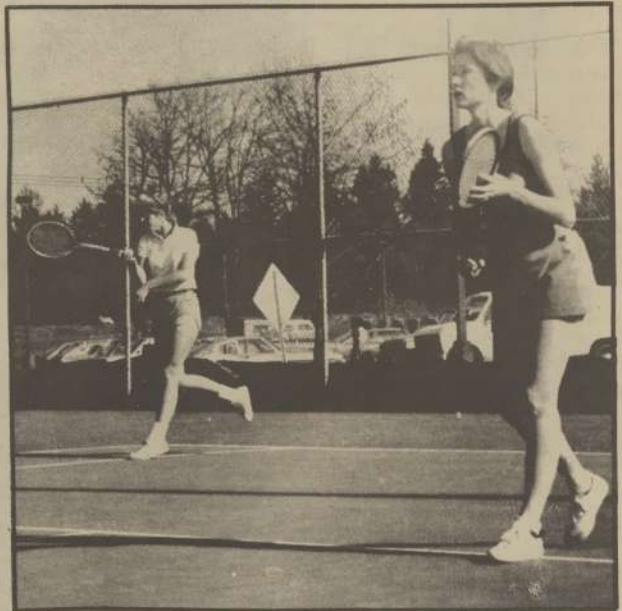
The women's next competition is the National Junior College Athletic Association National Tournament, to be held on the campus of Central Florida Community College in Ocala, Florida.

Michael said that the women are very excited to be going to the Nationals Tournament, but that competition there will be very tough on the Cougars.

"To be realistic about it, they really can't match up with the top four teams," she said. "If it's anything like last year, (the top four) will be from Texas."

"They're very excited about it," she said. "They're looking forward to the sunshine."

The women leave for Ocala this Sunday and begin play on Tuesday.

The men traveled to Gresham yesterday for a double header with Mt. Hood. They travel to Salem Saturday to face Chemeketa. The Cougs play their final home games with Umpqua CC next Tuesday at 1 p.m.

Robb Anderson needed all three sets to take a hard fought 6-4, 1-6, 7-6 win over Joel Bruxton of Umpqua.

Mike Woffard got a form of revenge for his loss as he teamed with Trillo to beat the Umpqua team of Christiansen and Paschke 6-1, 7-5. Doane and Anderson also won their doubles match 6-2, 7-6 over Sterling and Bravnold.

Campbell and Martinez finished doubles play for the Cougars, winning 6-1, 6-4 over Sands and Buxton.

The men lost to Multnomah School Of the Bible here last Thursday 9-0 in non-league action.

Coach Dave Buckley spoke optimistically about his team's chances in the OCCAA tournament to be held this Friday and Saturday in Albany.

"I think our chances are really good," he stated. "Our goal at the beginning of the season was to get everyone to regionals. I think that's achievable."

The Cougars must be one of the top four teams in the OCCAA tourney to qualify for the region-18 tournament. Also, individuals must make it to the semifinals of the tournament to qualify.
