

Hilton, Parker head A-A's

The trio of Shari Hilton, Debbie Koffel and Lynn Smyth dominated the javelin throw at Regionals placing in the top three.

The three showed their supremacy once again, but this time at the national meet.

A one-three-five placing by Hilton, Koffel and Smyth

respectively, was enough to power the Lady Cougs to an eighth place overall finish. Hilton had won the regional title earlier this month and captured the national crown with a 157-6 toss. Koffel fired the spear 143-8 and Smyth 136-4.

The two-mile relay, consisting of Petra Johnson, Suzy Thompson, Vicki Anderson and Tami Flores, placed fifth for Clackamas with a time of

9:31.56. Anderson captured a fifth place individually in the intermediate hurdles with a 1:04 blaze.

While the women's captured a respectable eighth place the men's team was fighting for a high showing. Going into the meet Kelly Sullivan, assistant coach, didn't expect miracles.

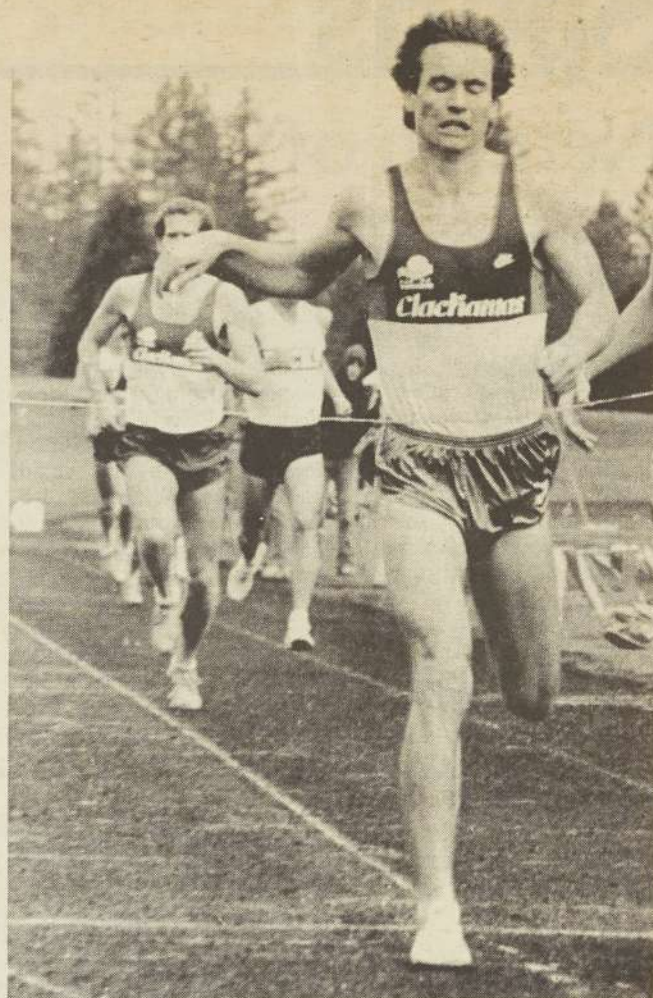
"I was very pleased with our performance. We had two school records broke in a field that was the toughest I have seen at this level," Sullivan said.

Distance runner Matt Parker looked to be on his way to a national crown going into the last lap of the 1500, but was passed by two opponents in the last stretch. Parker ended up with a third place finish, less than a half a second behind the winning time. Parker's time of 3:49.78 was marked by Sullivan as "outstanding."

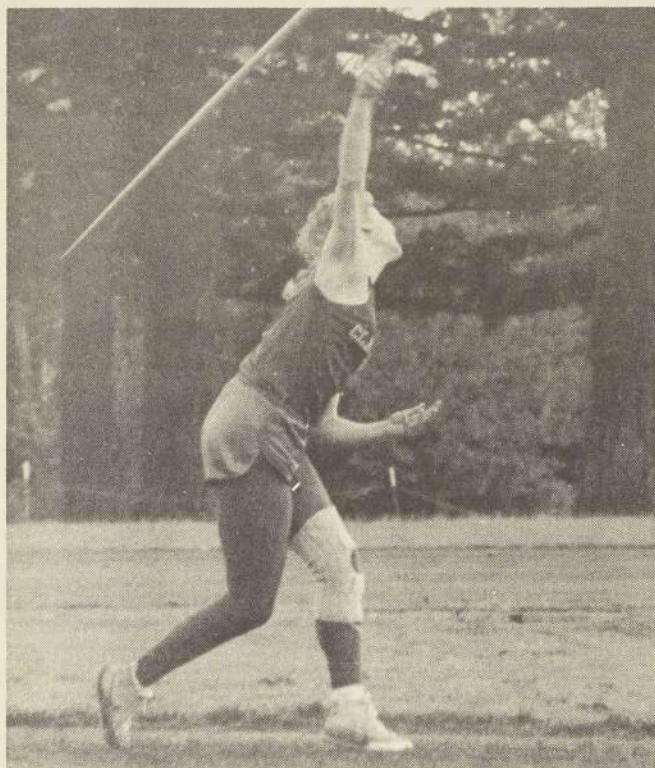
Sullivan said that the first and second place finishers in the 1500 both were representatives of their foreign countries' Olympic teams.

Jeff Tressler broke Clackamas' school record twice over, but it wasn't enough to place at the meet. In his first heat, Tressler ran a 47.8 400 meters, and then topped it the second heat with a 47.6 running.

Yul Provancha also set a school record in the 800 with a 1:50.9. Due to the fast times in

his heat, Provancha did not make the finals, but Sullivan said his time would have earned him fourth place in the finals.

Roy Session, who was named the Region 18 meet's outstanding male athlete, did not place, but ran a 10.54 100 meter and a 21.67 in the 200. Freshman Adam Jadeliski placed tenth in the 10,000 meter run and Rob Conner

placed sixth in his heat of the 5000 meters.

As a team the men placed 21st among 63 teams, but Sullivan wasn't concerned with what place the Cougs finished.

"The only area I wish we could have got some points in was the 800 with Yul (Provancha). It was just too bad that he was in such a fast heat," the coach said.
