

Taste of Oregon complete at historic site

Originally built in 1867 by Captain Edward Fellows, the restored house is now a combination art gallery and restaurant operated as a family business.

For three years the house has been a showcase of works from Northwest artists with everything from watercolor paintings to sculptures to off-loom weaving.

Fourteen months ago the owners found they had, "A little more space to utilize," said Jude Welter, one of the owners and managers of the house. With her sister Joan Wise, a lead partner in the restaurant, and husband Terry, they started out with running a coffee and dessert shop along with the gallery.

The project blossomed into a full-scale restaurant serving full luncheons between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. Tuesday thru Sunday. Each day a full menu for lunch is pre-selected with variation for those who wish for something different. The recipes are "tried and true" family favorites, said Wise. Included in every lunch is the

house dessert. Diners also have a selection of Oregon wines to choose from as well as beer.

The gallery portion of the house is primarily upstairs with hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday thru Sunday.

The works displayed are put through a jury process that's held once a month. They are always looking for new work, said Jude Welter. They also carry some national prints that are in demand, she said.

Along with the gallery and restaurant, the family operation also runs a custom framing and stained glass business, Welter said.

The house is also available for groups which can be scheduled for Mondays, so they can have the house to themselves.

Their lunch is a set price of \$4.95 and Oregon products are emphasized, Welter said. The Fellow's House is located at 461 South McLoughlin. It is listed with the Oregon Historical Society and represents a complete experience of Oregon arts. One might say it gives a taste of Oregon.

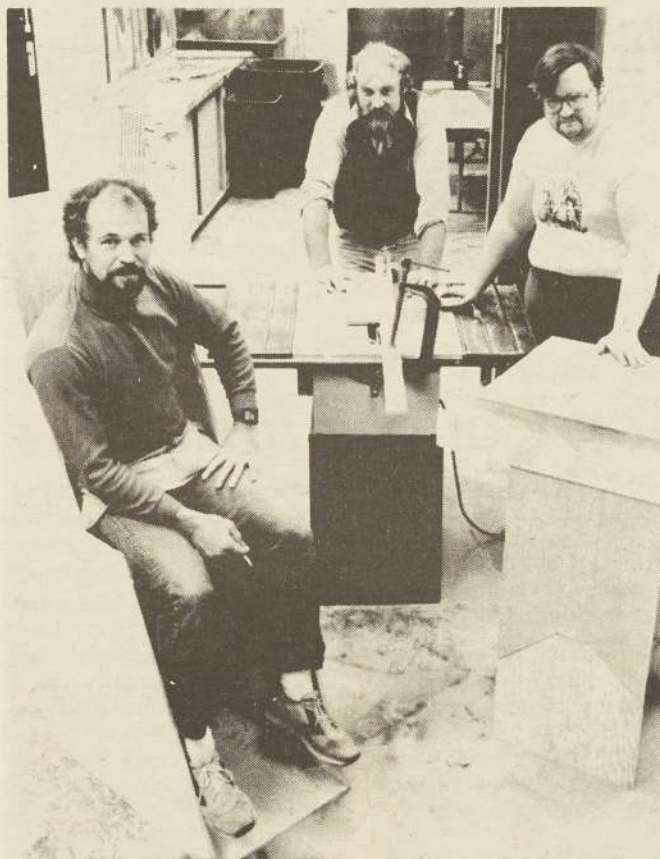
