

Cougar soccer team ties with Bellevue 4-4

Team spirit and good physical strength allowed the Clackamas Community College soccer team to play a tough game last Saturday against Bellevue, a team with an eight-win one-loss record.

In the game, Clackamas really showed their stuff. The score at halftime was Clackamas 1 and Bellevue 4. But at halftime, the team realized they needed to read-just a bit and they still had forty-five minutes to catch up.

They did, as during the second half Clackamas scored three goals in six minutes, and for the remainder of the game let Bellevue cross over the halfway line but twice. The game ended in a tie, 4 - 4.

Coach Juanos Szanto considers the game to be a great win because of Bellevue's

record. He said the main reason Clackamas didn't score any more was because of elementary mistakes that happen only once in a great while. Usually four goals is enough to win the game, but Clackamas gave Bellevue a run for their money.

Brian Gorsek scored all four goals and coach Szanto said the front line has improved 100 percent. As far as defending each other, sometimes the team disconnects and lets the other team score, but they are very much improved since the beginning of the season.

"We still believe we can make it to the playoffs," Szanto said. The team would need to win their next four games to do so. Szanto said "We have to play as much together as we can."

The team's next home game is Wednesday, Nov. 14 at 3 p.m. against Ft. Steilacoom.
