## **Clackamas** cagers beat No. 1 Chemeketa

Clackamas' men's basketball team defeated formerly undefeated Chemeketa in what Coach Royce Kiser called the perfect game Saturday night. "We had to play perfect to

beat this team and we did it! This is the same team that earlier had beaten us 84 to 69. This is one of the biggest victories we've had since I have been here at Clackamas," Kiser said.

Earlier in the week Clacamas' team was prone to sickness and injury. Jeff Richards, a usual starter, had a temperature as high as 103° the day before the Chemeketa game yet came out to play for eight minutes. Roger Thompson, another starter, was out with a dislocated thumb, He could be out for the rest of the season.


