Students choose comedies for one-act plays

Clackamas Community College students will direct and perform in the one-act plays "Amicable Parting" and "The Hairy Falsetto" in Clackamas Community College's McLoughlin Theater June 4 and 5 at noon and June 6 at 7:30 p.m.

The students are members of the one acts class taught by Theater Department Chairperson Jack Shields.

Neil Hass, a full-time student at the College is directing Linda Kuntz as Alicia and Craig Ronshauser as Bill in "Amicable Parting," a play written by George S. Kauffman and Leueen MacGrath. Hass said the play is a comedy about "a couple in the process of divorce."

Jim Nicodemus, a theater arts major at the College is the director of "Hairy Falsetto," a play by J.I. Rodale. Nicodemus described this play

as "an absurd comedy... it's a murder trial in which the big, bad wolf is being tried for murdering grandmother."

Cast members of "Falsetto" are: Diana Bauer as Grandma, Linda Kuntz as Little Red, David Albertson as The Wolf, Marty Yost as The District Attorney, Eric Steinhauser as The Judge and Barbara Winkles as Harpo.

The stage manager will be Joshua-Robin Collins. Sound and lights will be handled by Jim Nicodemus and Chuck Hamilton will be in charge of props and advertising. Barbara Winkles will assist Nicodemus in directing.

Members of the class chose plays which they wanted to direct. After reading through and hearing an explanation of each play by the director in class, the class chose which plays they would perform.

A third play was chosen but was canceled after one of the two cast members became ill.

Record Bonanza has items to 'buy, sell and trade'

A "Record Bonanza" will be held at Clackamas Community College on May 19 from 10-4 p.m. in the Community Center Mall. The fourth annual affair is aimed at record and memorabilia collectors and music fans in general Don Rogers, the coordinator of the program said.

"A broad spectrum of tastes" will be seen at the show, Rogers said, with prices

ranging from 10 cents to \$100 for those "super collectable" records. The event will be of interest to people "looking for records you can't find in the record stores," Rogers said.

For collectors who wish to sell their wares, tables can be rented at \$20 for one and 2 for \$35. For those who only have one or two items to sell, renting a table isn't required, Rogers said. Rogers likened the setup to a flea market where anyone can "buy, sell, or trade."

An added attraction to the day will be several members of former well-known rock-n-roll bands at an autograph table. The featured guests include Buck Ornsby of the Wailers, which was one of the first major rock bands to come out of the Northwest, and Bob Bogel

of the Ventures, who carry the title of being the biggest selling instrumental rock act ever, with more than 50 million records sold including their big hit "Wipe out," Rogers said.

Also featured will be the members of the Kingsmen, Mike Mitchel, Dick Peterson

and Lynn Eastman, who's foremost hit "Louie, Louie" was recently promoted in the Washington State Legislature to become the state's official rock song.
