Not many of the students on our campus are even aware that we have an Environmental Learning Center (ELC). The ELC is a program that was designed to show how land can be renovated for human use while at the same time benefitting the natural environment.

Located on the far side of the campus, next to the arts building, the Environmental Learning Center offers much for the public to learn, see, and do. The ELC boasts over a mile of gravel paths through 3.5 acres of an environmentally balanced ecosystem.

Flora and Fauna have been combined in a way to give the largest benefit possible to both the environment and public. Spawning beds and still water pools are provided for fish, while under foliage who trees provide cover for rabbits, squirrels, and birds. 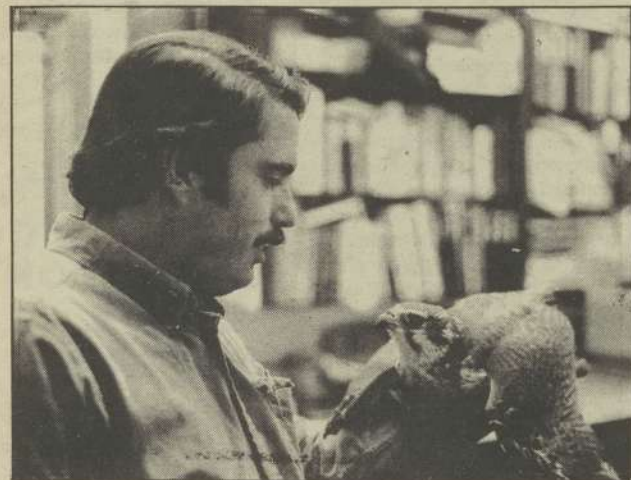
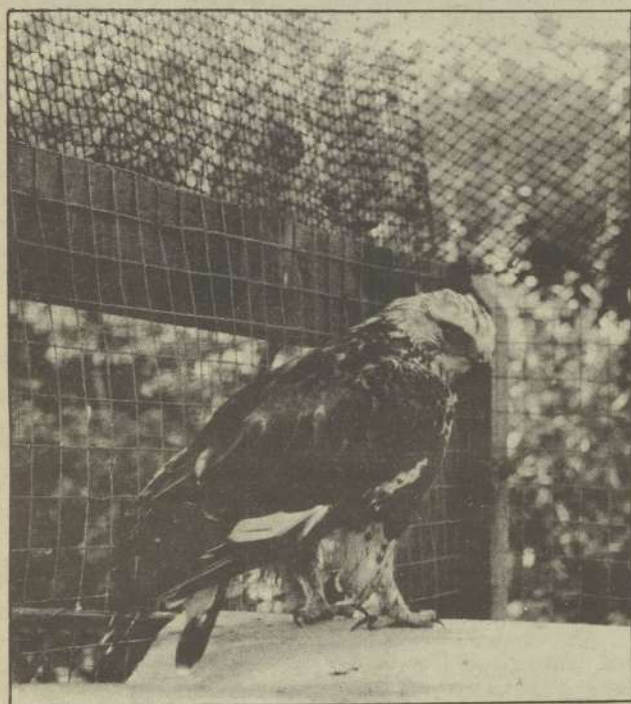

Every Sunday at 1:00, Dean Edwards flies the Red Tailed Hawk and the Prairie Falcon. The public is invited to view this impressive display. It is asked that a two dollar donation be made before the flights take place.
