Super-Simms leads Giants to NFL title romp

Ever have one of those days where everything turns out great?

The National Football League's New York Giants had a day like that Sunday when they galloped over the Denver Broncos 39-20 in Super Bowl XXI.

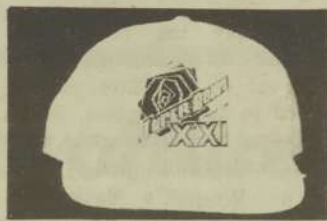
The game's margin of victory of 19 points were the least amount since the Washington Redskins stunned the Miami Dolphins 27-17 in Super Bowl XVII. The 39 points accumulated by the Giants is the second highest amount in the history of the game. The highest amount was the 46 set by the Chicago Bears last year.

Most valuable player honors were awarded to New York quarterback Phil Simms, who completed 22 for 25 passes, 268 yards, zero interceptions, and three touchdowns. Simms' completion percentage of 88 percent and his 10 consecutive completions set new Super Bowl records.

The Broncos struck first with a record-tying 48 yard field goal from kicker Rich Karlis, who would set another record by missing a 23-yarder, the shortest miss in Super Bowl history.

New York immediately struck back with a six-yard pass from Simms to Zeke Mowatt, giving the Giants a 7-3 lead. With 2:06 left in the first quarter, Denver took the lead when quarterback John Elway lunged into the end zone from four yards away.

With just under three minutes left in the first half, Elway made his second appearance in the end zone. This time he was sacked by Giant defensive end George Mar-



from Elway to Vance Johnson. A record was set for most points in one half by two teams with 40 in the second half. The combined 17 points by both teams in the first quarter tied a record set by San Francisco and Miami in Super Bowl XIX. The Giants set a new record for points in one half by one team with 30.

"When you think of the Denver Broncos, you think of John Elway. When you think of the Giants you don't think of Phil Simms. Well, now maybe they will," said Simms after his performance in Super Bowl XXI.

"Phil was unbelievable!" exclaimed head coach Bill Parcells, who was a victim twice of linebacker Harry Carson's Gatorade bucket shower.

From here, both teams will

start rebuilding, hoping to play in Super Bowl XXII on Jan. 31, 1988 at Jack Murphy Stadium in San Diego, California.

All in all from Sunday: Parcells got his share of "Gatorade," Simms got his day in the sun, and the Giants had one of the days where everything turns out great.



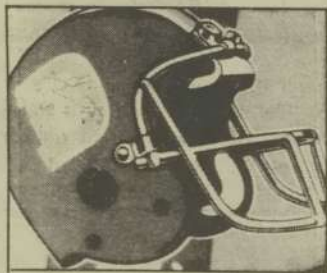

tin for a safety which made the halftime score 10-9 (another record for narrowest halftime margin ever in a super Bowl).

Five minutes into the third quarter New York took the lead for good when Simms hit Mark Bavaro on a 13-yard pass, moving ahead by six points, 16-10.

Kicker Roul Allegre extended that lead to nine by kicking a 21-yard field goal. With less than 30 seconds to go in the third quarter, runningback Joe Morris ran one yard for the Giants' third touchdown of the game. Morris' run was set up by Simms' 44-yard pass to Phil McConkey, ending the third quarter at 26-10.

The Giants opened up the fourth quarter with a six-yard pass from Simms to McConkey. With nine minutes to go in the game, Karlis kicked a 28-yard field goal to put Denver within 13 points, 26-13.

New York scored again on a two-yard run by Ottis Anderson. The Broncos finished the scoring with a 47-yard pass
