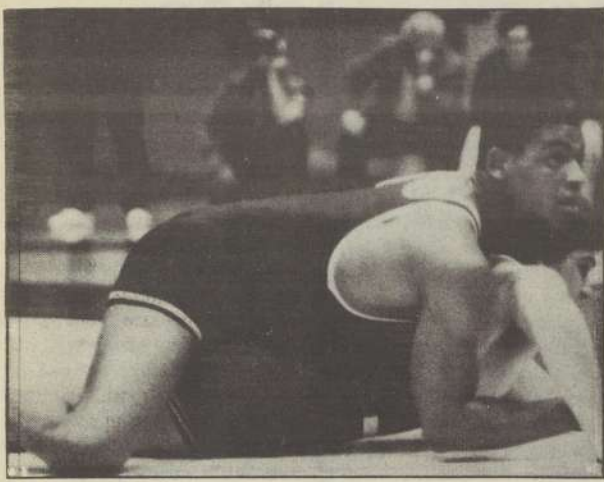

## Bowlers needed to compete in matches

"Getting people to show up is our main problem," said Clackamas Community College Bowling coach Mick McMahon.

The bowling team consists of two bowlers on the men's team and zero on the women's team. McMahon stressed that the team is "still in need of more people."

The college and McMahon are trying to build a team for the upcoming Associated College Unions International tournament. The qualifying match will be held Feb. 12 at 2:30 p.m. at Canby Bowl. The regional ACUI tournament is Feb. 20-21 at the University of Oregon in Eugene.

The pre-qualifying matches at Canby Bowl have an entry fee of \$5.50. People who want to participate can register with Paul Kylo in the student activities office.

The tournament is open to

any Clackamas student who is taking at least seven credit hours and maintaining a two-point grade average.

The regional tournament fees will be paid for by the Clackamas Associated Student Government. Those fees include transportation, bowling fees, motel, and food for the Friday and Saturday tournament.

It only takes one credit hour to be eligible for the College's bowling team. To qualify for scholarships only 10 credit hours are required.

"It's not difficult to build a national junior college championship team," said McMahon, who is coaching the team on a volunteer basis, "we're encouraging people to show up."

### Wrestling

Clackamas wrestlers missed first place in Saturday's tournament against 14 colleges from Washington, Oregon, and Idaho.

Outstanding athlete of the tournament was Junior Taylor for his overall performance Saturday. But there was an "overall good effort" by all of the team, according to Norm Berney, Clackamas Community College (CCC) head wrestling coach.

Some of the other winners were Ken Young and Doug Marpern both with seconds and Tim Jordan from Sheridan with fourth.

This was "one of the larger tournaments on the West Coast," said Berney. To implement the meet, Berney was appreciative of the "help from volunteers, work study and the wrestling team."

### Women's Basketball

The Clackamas women's basketball team played tremendous game Wednesday against Mt. Hood Community College. Final score was CCC 50, Mt. Hood 54.

Terri Boling led the team in rebounds with eight total, followed by Mitze Finn with seven. Cynthia Otis did not share in rebounds, but came in as one of the greatest shows on defense.

The leading scorers of the night were Karla Tiano with 12 points and Ann Schlegelmilch with 10. Bobbi Crenshaw had a great night also with a wild shot from behind the backboard that brought Clackamas within two points of Mt. Hood in the final five minutes of the game.

## Cougars earn 19th victory

Tonight at 8 p.m. the Clackamas Community College men's basketball team will host Lane Community College in Randall Hall.

On Jan. 30 Clackamas went south to Coos Bay to battle the Lakers of Southwestern Oregon Community College. The Cougars outscored the Lakers 37-23 in the second half to emerge victorious with a final score of 62-53.

Free throw shooting was a major factor in the game. Clackamas shot 23-30 for 77 percent and Southwestern Oregon shot 10-17 for 58 percent.

Clackamas' Pete Newlin lead all scorers with 20 points. Terry Newton and Rick Flemmer added 14 and 12 points respectively for the Cougars.

The Lakers were lead by the 17 points of Ken Hausinger. Center Robert Enge, who had a game high 21 rebounds, added 12 points, and Eric Epps contributed 10 for the Lakers.

Boxing or basketball, that was the question on the minds of several fans Jan. 28, at Clackamas Community College after the Cougars beat Mt. Hood Saints, 59-50.

Clackamas' Joe Clarizo and

Mt. Hood's Terrence Ransom were ejected from the second half of the game, each receiving a double-technical foul.

"Joe Clarizo was pushed twice by Terrence Ransom of Mt. Hood before retaliating with raised fists and swing," according to Mary Grout, athletic trainer for Clackamas Community College. Terry Newton shot for Clackamas making one basket out of two, while Sean Mitchell shot for Mt. Hood, receiving both points.

During the second half, Mt. Hood coach Andy McClouske walked on to the floor during play, resulting in another double technical foul. Newton commented that "I thought he was going to get his chair and sit down in the middle of the floor." Newton consequently shot the fouls making one point.

Newton summed it up by saying why the Cougars beat the Saints for the sixth consecutive year in Randall Hall. "We got lucky
