

#### Bowlers needed to compete in matches

The bowling team consists of two bowlers on the men's team and zero on the women's team. McMahon stressed that the eam is "still in need of more reople."

The college and McMahon are trying to build a team for the upcoming Associated College Unions International tournament. The qualifying match will be held Feb. 12 at 2:30 p.m. at Canby Bowl. The regional ACUI tournament is Feb. 20-21 at the Universtity of Oregon in Eugene.

The pre-qualifying matches at Canby Bowl have an entry fee of \$5.50. People who want to participate can register with Paul Kyllo in the student activities office.

The tournament is open to

any Clackamas student who is taking at least seven credit hours and maintaining a twopoint grade average.

The regional tournament fees will be paid for by the Clackamas Associated Student Government. Those fees include transportation, bowling fees, motel, and food for the Friday and Saturday tournament.

It only takes one credit hour to be eligible for the College's bowling team. To qualify for scholarships only 10 credit hours are required.

"It's not difficult to build a national junior college championship team,' McMahon, who is coaching the team on a volunteer basis, "we're encouraging people to show up."

Free throw shooting was a major factor in the game. Clackamas shot 23-30 for 77 percent and Southwestern Oregon shot 10-17 for 58 per-

Clackamas' Pete Newlin lead all scorers with 20 points. Terry Newton and Rick Flemmer added 14 and 12 points respectively for the Cougars.

The Lakers were lead by the 17 points of Ken Hausinger. Center Robert Enge, who had a game high 21 rebounds, added 12 points, and Eric Epps contributed 10 for the Lakers.


