Cougars capture sixth, seventh straight wins

The Clackamas men's basketball team will host Portland Community College tonight at 8 p.m. in Randall Hall. The Panthers' feature forward is Jeff Whipps of Lake Oswego.

The Cougars had three players score 20 points each ' when they ran past Linn-Benton Community College on Feb. 7 in Albany.

Post Russell Livingston and guards Terry Newton and Jeff Stein combined for 60 points (20 a piece) as the Cougars topped the Roadrunners 88-81. The trio shot a combined 70 percent from the field on 26 of 37.

Cougar wing Pete Newlin added 12 points and freshman post Eric Christen, eight as Clackamas improved their record to 21-5. In addition to his 20 points, Newton had a game high of nine assists and a team high six rebounds.

Leading the way for the Roadrunners was 6'5" forward Scott Montgomery, who had 25 points and 13 rebounds. Guard Jeff Vinson added 24 points and five assists

Clackamas shot 38 of 60 from the field (63 percent) and 11 of 15 from the free throw line (72 percent). Linn-Benton shot 32 of 57 for 56 percent from the field and 13 of 19 from the free throw line for 68 percent.

The Cougars outscored the Roadrunners 46-44 in the first half and 42-37 in the second to hold on to the victory.

Saturday's game was the second time Clackamas and Linn-Benton have played this season. On Jan. 17 the Cougars crushed Linn-Benton in front of te home crowd in Randall Hall by a score of 91-68.

Six players scored in double figures for the Clackamas men's basketball team as they pounded Lane Community College 84-61

on Feb. 4. It was the second time the two teams have met this season. In Eugene on Jan. 16 Lane tripped the Cougars 84-83 in overtime. Rebounding played

a major part in the game as Clackamas beat Lane to the boards by a 48-34 margin.

At halftime the Cougars held a 39-30 lead. In the second half, the Cougars came out fighting and outscored Lane 45-31 to secure the victory.

Cougar post Eric Christen provided the icing on the cake when he took a missed shot and forced it through the rim in one decisive motion, which received a deafening roar from the home crowd.

The Cougars were led by guard Terry Newton, who scored 18 points, including a perfect 7-7 from the free throw line and one three point field goal. Newton also had a game high five assists.

Christen, who made all four of his eight field goals in the second half, scored 14 points for the Cougars. Todd Harris came off the bench and made three point

goals and four free throws route to a 13 point performant for Clackamas.

Russell Livingston scored points and grabbed a game his 12 rebounds, and Pete Newl and Jeff Stein netted 10 poin each for the Cougars.

The Titans were led by 6'1 center Ron Schaffeld, who scor 17 points and hauled down ni rebounds. Schaffeld's supporting cast included Tony Broado with 10 points, Pat Bodine ar Steve Courtney each with eigh and Mike Maki with seven off the
