"The Mousetrap": a superb mystery

Reporting II Class "The Mousetrap" opened at Clackamas Community College's McLoughlin Theatre last Thursday and caught the audience's attention from beginning to end.

English The play by playwright, Agatha Christie, is set in a small country inn, not far from London. It opens with the arrival of guests during a snow storm and the discussion of a recent murder in the town nearby. Then one of the guests is also murdered and suspicion is pointed in many directions. Unless you are familiar with the plot, it is doubtful that you'll be able to predict the outcome.

Trotter is played by David Harvey. Robert Ems is cast as the elderly Major Metcalf. They all speak with an English accent which lends authenticity but also requires concentration. The quick, crisp speech was sometimes a little difficult to understand.

The audience had three favorites. Pamela McConnell, the very critical Mrs. Boyle, v one. She projected her voice v and added some humor to scene. The audience loved Ri Burrough's characterization the young, eccentric Christopl Wren. He prompted ma laughs, as did Deborah Hu phrey's portrayal of Mm Paravicini. Her Italian accent convincing.

The set was cleverly design by David Smith-English. It cludes an entry, some stairs, a two doors which supposedly l to other rooms. The furnishin have to accommodate seven c members at a given time. It is e dent that a great deal of work involved in the construction.

The costumes, by Merril Lyn Taylor, add much to ea character study.
