Baseball coaches involved in slimy trade

The Clackamas men's baseball team, set on winning a northwest championship this season, have gone to some highly unusual methods to make them the favorites in league competition.

In a highly top secret investigation, this reporter has learned that Clackamas athletic director Dale McGriff, and Clackamas baseball coach Paul Roeder are involved in a scam to recruit major league baseball players. When confronted with these accusations, McGriff denied any wrong doing. "Free agency rules allow major league baseball players to play where they choose.
