## Students support Faith as pres.

The Student Government controversy is at an end and both parties show relief and positive attitudes.

How do Frothingham and Debbie Baker, student government advisor, feel the meeting went?

"I think the meeting went fairly well. Everyone was calm, cool and collected in what was a very difficult situation for everybody," Frothingham added.

Faith Taylor, new president-elect expressed "the stress was

knocking me down. I just thought what unfortunate and a waste of time," but "the meeting was incredible. Without the student support I don't think I could have made it."

The executive session was according to Taylor her most nervous moment but she felt confident. "I felt I had a strong defense. I felt that my testimony was good. I had a feeling I had to have won."

How does Taylor feel about being president? "I'm ready. I am - ready! I feel so good I might jump into the national presidential election."

The project Taylor will be involved in will be selecting her cabinet. "I want to get together real quick so we can start working," Taylor said. Baker stated as soon as the cabinet is selected they go on a training retreat. There they will learn about the college, the red tape that exists, job responsibilities, team building, goal setting and planning.

Taylor stated the first project she will be working on as president is revising section 14 of the election code. Baker added "the

elections office (of Clackamas County) has indicated that they are interested in helping us with that." Frothingham stated he would like to help Taylor to get acquainted with all the issues he has been working on for the past year.

Any conclusion about the controversy? "I think it's an unfortunate experience, but I think it was a good learning experience," Baker said.

"I took a very unfortunate incident to pack out the Board Room," Frothingham said, adding that two good things came out of the meeting. "Faith is cleared without a doubt, and hopefully it will motivate more students to become involved," Frothingham said.

Taylor concluded "this will make me a stronger leader. I've always been strong. I've always worked to be a leader. But you can't be a leader without support. Therefore, I've to keep good communication. I'm always open. I really care about what the (students) would like to see get done at the school."
