Some critics say that George Bush was elected because he took the initiative to attack Michael Dukakis on issues.

The fact that Dukakis did not defend several of these accusations may be a major reason he lost the election.

It's up to the people to decide what kind of president they want. The negative campaigning is here to stay. Proof of this is Dukakis, who tried to win the election without it, but was unsuccessful. The people need to see through the negative ads and see what the candidate stands for, rather than believe what his opponent says he stands for. They will have another chance to do that in four years.
