

# Borrelli and Fulton censured for assault

Two Clackamas Community College students who used an unauthorized school vehicle will have a hearing tomorrow before the Ministry of Education to determine whether or not they will be expelled from Clackamas.

The Print Sports Editor Mark A. Borrelli, and staff writer Dan Fulton are alleged to have used a school car to travel to Chemeketa Community College in Salem. Borrelli, in a fit of rage, stormed into the office of The Courier-4 (the Chemeketa student paper), and is said to have become abusive and violent.

"Mr. Borrelli and Mr. Fulton used an unauthorized school vehicle to travel down to Chemeketa. They were reported to have been traveling at speeds up to 100 miles an hour," said Roberts.

The motive for the trip stems from a letter to the editor that Courier-4 Sports Editor Todd Helton sent to The Print. In the letter, Mr. Helton accused Borrelli of being biased and over-using cliches.

Borrelli and Fulton arrived at the office of the Courier-4 at 3 p.m. Friday. Borrelli was outraged with the letter that Helton sent to The Print. They were met at the door of the Chemeketa paper's offices by adviser Clifford Brock. Fulton then landed a vicious forearm to the side of Brock's head, rendering him unconscious. This left Borrelli all alone with Helton. Helton ran for awhile, but could not escape Borrelli. Borrelli finally caught Helton and landed a nasty boot to the side of his head. Then, with Helton lying mercifully on the floor, Borrelli got up on the desk and was reported to have been yell-

ing cliches at Helton before flying off of the desk and landing full force on the prone sports editor.

"I'll tell you, yes I did it. But that punk Helton had it coming. Who is he to criticize my sports section when he doesn't have one himself?" asked Borrelli.

"We were on a mission. We went, we saw, and we kicked their ass!!! That's the last time the Courier-4 will ever mess with The Print," said Fulton.

Print adviser Linda (scoop) Vogt was shocked at the behavior of her two writers. "Mark and Dan are such nice boys. They were always quiet in class and respected everyone. I can't believe that they would do anything like that. It hurts me like I was their mother," said Vogt.

Helton and Brock were unavailable for comment, as the stitches in their mouths made it

hard to talk. Both are listed in fair condition at Salem Memorial Hospital. If you would like to send flowers, they are in room 221.

"It's unexcusable what those two hoodlums did, and I hope that Clackamas see's that they are properly punished for their

actions," said Jerry Burger, Chemeketa administrator.

Should they be banned from Clackamas, Paul Roeder would replace Borrelli as Sports Editor. Fulton, a baseball pitcher, would lose his spot to Amber Cordry.

# Merrill to be investigated for steroid use
