

Cougars down Grays Harbor 17-1

Clackamas Community College's football team boosted their win-loss record to 5-4 for the season in their game Saturday as they defeated Grays Harbor 17-13.

Clackamas' scoring began just five minutes into the first quarter with a 92 yard drive. In the drive, quarterback Pat Moran passed the ball twice to receivers J.B. Burton (13 yard pass) and to Steve Rumrey for a 26 yarder.

The Cougar squad rushed the ball eight

times with Andy Phillips finishing the Cougar score with a seven yard dash into the end zone. Buddy Patnode kicked in the extra point giving the Cougars a 7-0 lead.

Early in the second period, Patnode booted a 28 yard field goal giving the Cougars a 10 point lead.

The Cougars' strong defense supported them throughout the first half. There were three fumble recoveries; Bill Sehorn made a fumble recovery on the Cougars' 16 yard line, Chris Conklin made a recovene the 30 yard line, and defensive back Schneider grabbed a fumble near th gars' 50 yard line.

Grays Harbor scored their first down in the third quarter with a 3 pass making the score 10-7.

The Cougars' second touchdown after Schneider made his fumble of which put the Cougars on Grays H 49 yardline. Patnode took advantage Cougars' field position with a 43 ye to Rumrey, putting the ball on the line. Three plays later Lucky Rich jumped one yard into the end zone the Cougars a ten point lead 17-7.
