Cougars defeat Cavaliers

The Clackamas Community College men's basketball team will play the Willamette University J.V.'s Friday, Jan. 14 at 5:30 in Salem following a contest against Chemeketa Community College Wednesday. When they return from the Salem game, the Cougars will host a league game with Judson Baptist at 7:30 Saturday in Randall Gym.

Clackamas has racked up a winning record against all of this week's opponents. They hold a 15-2 edge over Chemeketa, and a 9-7 edge with Judson Baptist (the Cougars won both 1976 contests 102-71 and 105-90).

Tuesday, Jan. 4, the Cougars raised their season's record to 7-3 when they downed Concordia College 94-59.

Clackamas, which now averages better than 91 points per game on offense, allowed the Cavaliers only one field goal during the first 10 minutes of play, as they raced to a quick 29-5 lead.

Preston Martin, out of Rex Putnam H.S., scored 21 points and hauled in 22 rebounds for the Cougars. Freshman Jeff Nilsen, Lakeridge, tallied 18 points and 11 rebounds. Sophomore Frank Gibson and Frosh Jim Coffman contributed 14 points each.

The Cougars bombed Concordia even though they lacked three starters. Chuck Sampson, Rick McGowan and John Van-Acker missed the Concordia contest because of late return from Christmas break. They are expected to be ready for conference play. Bill Ullman (6-7 center) may miss the remainder of the season because of a health problem and Doug Kanis (6-9 backup center) has left the team for personal reasons.

In more recent basketball action, the Cougars dropped two games, one to Blue Mountain Community College and the other to Linn Benton Community. According to Coach Len Tirrill, "The problem was that we just didn't play up to our capabilities, and when you don't do that, you can't expect to win." Hopefully the Cougars will play up to their capabilities in their upcoming contests with Willamette and Judson Baptist Colleges.

ACU-I tournaments slated

Activities from billiards to bridge are offered in the Association of College International (ACU-I) Tournaments. Clackamas Community College students requiring 6 or more credit hours are eligible for competition. Sign-up sheets are available in the Community Center game room at Randall Hall lobby. The activities will begin on January 20.

Winners of the tournament will receive a trophy and will also represent the college in the Region XIV tournament which is being held at the University of Oregon, Eugene.

The Regional tournament will begin on February 10-12.

Clackamas Community College's wrestling team will host its first home meet on Friday, January 14, at 7 p.m. at Umpqua Community College.

The meet with the Timbermen will be the Cougars' first dual meet of the conference season.

The next day the Cougars travel to Salem to challenge Chemeketa Community College at 7 p.m.

Wrestlers who have performed well so far for Clackamas include sophomore Ziegler (Rex Putnam, 126 pounds) with a 12-3 record; freshman Don Zellner (stone, 134) 8-3; sophomore Steve Hannon (Clackamas, 142) 7-0; and Jeff Harmon (Dalles, 177) 10-2.

One of the top meets of the season for the Cougars on Saturday, Jan. 15, as they host the Clackamas Community College Invitational, beginning at 9 a.m. at Randall Hall Gym.
