

Women drop opener

Clackamas Community College opened its 1977 women's basketball season Tuesday, Jan. 11 against Linfield College in McMinnville with a 41-31 loss as the host Wildcats broke the game open in the second half.

Lori Ruthenbeck and Cheri Anderson played well on defense, according to Coach Nancy Mikleton, and Mary Moyes was the leading scorer with 10 points.

The women were tied, 18-18, at halftime, but Linfield's inside game proved too strong in the second half.

First-year coach Nancy Mikleton begins the season with three sophomores and seven freshmen and it will take the Cougars some time to become a cohesive unit, she said.

"We hope to run a tough defense using both man-to-man and zone. Our offense allows shooting from all players, yet needs time together to jell," explained Mikleton.

The Cougars will rely on good overall quickness to compensate for a lack of height.

Key personnel include quick, playmaking guard Cheri Anderson (5-5, frosh), good shooter Mary Moyes (5-7, frosh), key rebounders Diane Winans (5-9, soph.), and Lori Ruthenbeck (5-8, soph.), and new comer Tami Wulf (5-II, frosh).

Clackamas plays in a community college league with Mt. Hood, Clark, and Lane. The top teams qualify for the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women regionals to be held in March. The women's team play their next game tonight against Pacific University's J.V.'s in Forest Grove at 7 p.m.
