The advisory committee will look at programs for disadvantaged and handicapped persons and will make recommendations for new programs, recommend allocation of money for these programs and discuss problems in these areas.

Thomas was on a steering committee and a task force that dealt with problems of the disadvantaged and handicapped in post secondary education.
