## Ethics added

This spring term will see an evening class added to the schedule. Elementary Ethics (Phil-202) will be taught Monday nights 7 to 10 p.m. by Mayo Roy, philosophy and psychology instructor.

The class will study early and later works of John Dewey, American educator and father of progressive education. Texts include "Human Nature and Conduct" and an earlier book by Dewey dealing with American Ethics. Much of the class period will be devoted to open discussion.

Roy also added that her Problems of Philosophy (Phil 201) class will be scheduled an hour earlier next term. The shift to 11 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday, Friday was made in order that more students could adjust their schedules to include this beginning philosophy course.

## Board openings

Two positions on the Clackamas Community College Area Education District Board will be open for election on Tuesday, April 19.

Interested persons seeking election to these positions must file with the county elections department no later than March 15.

The two available positions (non-salaried) are currently held by Roger Rook (Zone 3) and Bonnie Jones (Zone 6). Both positions are four-year terms and begin July 1, 1977.

In order to file, a petition with 25 registered voters must be secured from within the district or \$10 can be paid as a filing fee.

The Red Cross Bloodmobile Unit which was in the Community Center building last Wednesday, collected 83 units of whole blood. The set goal for Clackamas Community College was 85 units. 92 people presented themselves on Wednesday to donate, but nine were deferred for various medical reasons.

## Instructors needed

Because of the tremendous interest generated by Clackamas Community College's Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) training courses, there are not enough qualified instructors to hold all the classes needed. Interest is growing in this first-aid tech-

nique and the rise in heart attacks and disease in the United States make training worthwhile for all people.

The course itself involves six hours of instruction spread over three nights. The classes are limited to students.

An instructor's course would be approximately 10 hours of training and would be taught by the American Red Cross or the Oregon Heart Association. Training courses are currently being offered at CCC and area community schools in conjunction with the American Red Cross.
