

Schools to compete in CCC's annual Jazz Week festivities

Stage bands from nearly 60 high schools and junior high schools will compete March 10, 11 and 12 at Clackamas Community College as part of the college's annual Jazz Week festivities.

The bands will perform in competition with the top schools in each classification (junior high, A, AA, AAA) participating in evening playoffs.

There will also be daily clinics conducted by guest musicians saxophonist Don Lanphere and trumpeter Jon Pugh. Lanphere and Pugh, two veteran professional musicians, will also perform as guest soloists at the evening concerts, which will be conducted following the playoff competition.

The schedule for the stage band competition, which includes bands from throughout the Northwest begins at 1 p.m. Thursday, March 10, and will continue all day Friday and Saturday.

CCC's jazz ensemble will stage performances Friday and Saturday evenings.

The judges for the competition will include Lanphere, Pugh, Dale Beacock, of Clark College's music department, and Bill Humiston, of Molalla High School.

The cost of event will be \$1 for daily sessions and \$2.50 for the evening concerts.
