## Loans dropped

Recently, a small number of students have been taking advantage of the Student Emergency Loan Program to the detriment of other students.

The major problem Clackamas Community College is facing with its Emergency Loan Program is that students are not paying the loans back on time. Once the funds for emergency loans are depleted, other students needing loans cannot obtain them. Since October 1975 the Financial Aid Office has become increasingly aware of the problem with the Student Emergency Loans. Students have repeatedly been warned not to abuse the system or they will face sanctions.

Clackamas County Mental Health Program is planning as part of its Community Service, a Transition Group for the Newly Single.

The focus will be on sharing of the pain, anger and fear that often goes with the situation. There will be some time at becoming aware of what changes occurred prior to becoming single. There will also be concentration on "change" as an opportunity for growth and experimentation.

The group is open to women up to age 55 who are undergoing stresses due to separation, divorce or death. This is not a therapy group, but an opportunity for support, growth and self expression.

The series starts March 17 from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. in the Education Building on the Marylhurst Campus, and will meet weekly for six weeks. There is no charge.
