

Conference Set for CCC business students

Students from 13 Oregon colleges, including Clackamas Community College, will converge at the Thunderbird Inn in Coos Bay to match skills in 16 business-related categories at the annual Oregon State Leadership Conference.

The conference, March 31 through April 2, is sponsored by Phi Beta Lambda, a national organization for college business students.

Hosted by the PBL chapter at Southwestern Oregon Community College, the gathering is put on by the state executive board. Most contestants will be students in a business curriculum including office skills and business teacher education.

Phi Beta Lambda has chapters in 46 states, each of which holds an annual leadership conference to draw its widely dispersed members together for general assemblies, competitive events, workshops, entertainment, and the election of its state officers. Three of the present Oregon PBL state officers came from the CCC chapter.

Larry McAlpine, former CCC student now attending Portland State, is the Oregon State Chapter President of PBL. His wife Lori, also a former student at CCC, is the state treasurer. Marji Patrick, now attending Clackamas, is the publicity-communications director for the state chapter of PBL.

Around 100 students are expected for this year's gathering. Members who place in the competitions are then eligible to attend the annual National Leadership Conference to be held this year in Denver, Colorado.

Deadline for registration is March 10, and students are still being encouraged to sign up. Accounting, Business Communication, Business Law and Economics are some of the events to be held.

Town meeting slated

Saturday, March 12, in the Oregon City High School cafeteria (1306 Twelfth St.), representatives from city and county government will meet with concerned citizens to discuss and propose solutions for community problems.

The Town Meeting is sponsored by several civic organizations, the City Commissioners, the Enterprise-Courier and the Oregon City Chamber of Commerce. According to Baird Langworthy, coordinator of the job skill improvement program at Clackamas Community College, the meeting will stress

community involvement and be "contingent on the creativity of the people who attend."

"If you have a gripe about downtown parking, land use planning, good drinking water, adequate sewers, the crime rate or anything pertinent to the next decade, we want to hear it," Langworthy said. "The whole purpose of the Town Meeting is to seek solutions and directions for actions."

Saturday's meeting will last from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and 200 to 300 persons are expected to attend. There will be a one dollar fee to cover the cost of lunches and materials. More information is available by calling 656-1619.

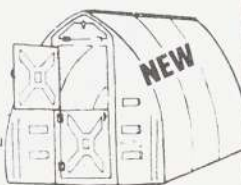
