

Physics class readies energy exposition

Conservation of energy is an important issue and in view of this issue the General Physics (PH202) class will host a two-day energy carnival at Clackamas Community College in May.

"It is an attempt to show people that they can be in control of their own energy situation," said Physics instructor Mike Aronson.

The exposition will offer hints to conserve energy, ways to create your own supplementary energy sources and workshops to teach energy conserving techniques.

"For years energy in America has been really cheap and we never really thought about it," said Aronson.

All exhibits will be centered around what a person can do for himself and his family. A workshop on solar house design and energy conservation in your home will be offered.

Aronson said the focus will be on people. Long lectures will not be held because the project has been directed toward a

seeing and doing project, providing information needed for people to survive in a lower energy consumption situation without affecting their living standards.

The energy fair will be held May 13 and 14 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and will include exhibits in the Community Center Mall, Randall Gym, the flag pole area and the Community Center parking lot.

Three types of energy-saving autos will be on exhibit including an electric car, a propane car and a 1977 Honda. These will be in the Community Center parking lot and people will be able to ride in them.

Physics student Walt Sherman will exhibit a model of a solar diode. The function of a solar diode is to pump hot water into houses during the day and not let it out at night. The diode will be constructed from common materials.

The exposition is also open to private and industrial sources and individual inventors are invited to participate with exhibits or working models.
