

CCRT schedules fund-raiser for regional trip

If theatre addicts missed "Spoon River Anthology" the first time around, they have another shot at the spectacular play. CCRT will be performing at 7:30 p.m., April 6th in the Community Center Building in an attempt to raise money for regional competition in Bremerton, Wash.

A fund raising event has been set for Wednesday, April 6, in the Clackamas Community Center Building at 7:30 p.m. for the Clackamas County Repertory Theatre (CCRT).

The Repertory Theatre group, composed of a cross section of people from the community who are interested in acting, was recently selected to represent the State of Oregon at the regional American Community Theatre Association competition in Bremerton, Washington, April 9.

This is the fourth year the American Community Theatre Association has held the competition. CCRT will compete against other community theatre groups from Washington and Alaska.

Every fourth year national competition selects one theatre to represent the United States in the International Festival in Monaco.

An evening of entertainment April 6 will raise funds for the local group to go to the regional competition and will include: CCRT's "Spoon River Anthology;" music by the Ogden Junior High School jazz band which placed second in state competition; Mike Drummer, an 11 year-old puppeteer-triologist; Schizoid Plus, a college acting group and dancers from Maralee's Dance Studio.

Members of the "Spoon River Anthology" cast include: Neil Hass, JoAnn Mason, Ardyss Reed, Robert A. Reed, Brian Puckett, Terry Timmen, Millard Word, Barbara Bragg and Roby Robinson, all of Oregon City; Lynne Meyer and Billy Ragsdale, Portland; and Marilou Shanklin, Milwaukie.

Tickets, priced at \$3 are available from members of CCRT and from many service clubs.

Tickets will also be available at the door April 6.
