Security promises quick eradication

Neutria rapes campus women

Women walking alone at night on the Clackamas Community College campus should avoid the Ecology Pond/Arboretum area, according to Stan Johnson, chief of campus security.

Approximately 18 women have been sexually assaulted by a giant neutria who has been making its home near the pond, said Johnson.

The women report that the giant animal creeps up behind the blooming forsythia before making its strike.

"It bonked me on the back of the head with its huge buck teeth," said one unidentified miss. "I didn't have a chance to defend my honor."

Other victims have reported a similar modus operandi, said Johnson.

Meanwhile, Johnson has been organizing a special S.W.A.N. team to begin preparations for the giant neutria's extermination.

"We might be able to do it with napalm," said Johnson, a Vietnam veteran. "But our accuracy is of the utmost importance. We have to down the vermin in handicapped zone."
