Cougars Upset Lane

At the Oregon Community College Athletic Association Invitational, the Clackamas Cougar squad upset Lane Cougars by beating the favored team 129-94. Cougars won the first annual OCCAA meet that was held on the Clackamas campus.

Kelly Sullivan won the 300-meter relay chase for CCC, with a time of 3:15.7.

Oregon City's Alan Knoop took first place for Clackamas in 31-09.7.

Other firsts included Lynn Taylor, 15.2 for the 120 yd. high hurdle.

Hadley's winning leap of 21-4 in the long jump, and Frank Gibson, out of Milwaukie, took first in the shot put with a leap of 6-4. Joel Johnson of Lane also cleared that height, but lost to Hadley with fewer misses.

Jeff Harmon had two second place finishes for the Cougars. He had a toss in the shot and set a school record in the javelin with a heave of 201-2.

Hadley, in addition to his winning leap in the long jump, was second in the shot vault at 13-0 and third in the triple jump at 42-8, behind Dave Reed, also of Clackamas, who jumped 42-10 1/2.

Trackers display early power

The Clackamas Community College women's track team showed their power over several colleges twice this past week with second and first place finishes at the Oregon College of Education (OCE) Invitational Thursday, and the Linfield Invitational Saturday.

Competing against eight colleges at the OCE meet, the Cougar women took second place to only the home team. Although the Clackamas squad captured the most first places, they were overcome by the Wolves' numbers.

Coach Roger Smith's young team managed five new school records and several seasons bests. Both the mile and 440 yd. relay teams took first places and established new records. The mile relay squad of Tammy Likens, Debbie Leathers, Verna Simon, and Amanda Eggleston ran a 4:25 time. The 440 yd. relay turned in a 51.8 record, running the race were Cindy Peterson, Barb Johnson, Tammy Likens, and Amanda Eggleston.

Capturing other first places for the Cougars were Verna Simon in the 440 yd. intermediate hurdles with a 71.5 time, Karen Llam's winning throw in the shot-put, and Amanda Eggleston's 62.6 440 yd dash win.

In the meet at Linfield, which included Lane, Chemeketa, Linn Benton, Clark, Umpqua, and Mt. Hood Colleges, Clackamas racked up a 98 point score, 35 points ahead of nearest competitor Linfield.

Among top honors Cougar women took were the mile relay, with a time of 4:24.7, a new school and meet record. Running the relay for Clackamas were Tammy Likens, Verna Simon, Sandy Killian, and Amanda Eggleston.

Verna Simon set a new school record with her 69.5 intermediate hurdle victory.

Barbara Johnson took the 100-meter high hurdles in 15.7 and was followed to the tape by Verna Simon, running a 16.5. Johnson set a new meet record, breaking the old record of 16.8 set in 1976.

Debbie Leathers captured the 800-meter run with a time of 1:28.9, a new school record. Sandy Killian was second in the 800 with her 2:35 time.

Killian and Jean Sandwick both ran doubles for Clackamas, along with her 800 meter second, Killian took another second in the 5000 meter and Sandwick ran both the 1500 and 3000 meters, racking up two more seconds for the Cougars.

Besides her winning leg on the 400-meter and mile relay, Eggleston scored firsts in the 400-meter dash with a time of 61.9 and in the 200-meter dash where she clocked 27 seconds flat, both school and meet records.

In the javelin competition, Tami Wulf tossed the spear 128-2 to take second place and set a new school record. Wulf's throw was only 13 inches from qualifying her for upcoming regional competition.
