

# Tracksters place high in two

The Cougar women's track team competed in two meets this past week, the first at Lane Community College on Thursday and the other an invitational at Mt. Hood Community College on Saturday.

In Thursday's meet, the Cougars scored second to OCE, 109-103. Other teams were Central Oregon 67, Southern Oregon 65, Linfield 26, University of Oregon J.V. 21, Oregon Track Club 20, Linnenton 19, Umpqua 8, Lane 4.

Jean Sandwick had an outstanding day for the Cougar girls as she established new school records in both the 3,000 and 5,000 meter runs. Her times of 11:25.1 and 15:16.6 brought her second and third place honors.

Verna Simon took first place in the long jump with a 15-1 leap into a strong wind. Simon, out of LaSalle high school, also established a personal best of 16.2 with her second place finish in the 100 meter high hurdles. In the intermediate hurdles, Simon captured second place with a 69.9 time and also ran a leg on the Regional-qualifying relay team which ran a 4:17.3 time. Others running on the mile relay team were Debbie Leathers, Amanda Eggleston, and Tammy Likens.

Amanda Eggleston, Estacada, took three events and a third in the meet, and set three personal best marks. Eggleston took the 100 meters in 61.7 and the 200 in 26.9. She finished third in the 100 meters with a time of 13.1.

According to Coach Smith, "the girls did a super job, although we're not quite satisfied with the field event performances of the team."

In the Mt. Hood Invitational, the Cougars ran away with first place with a 139 point total to second place George Fox's 72. Mt. Hood gathered 64 points, Willamette had 56, Portland State 52, Clark 18, Chemeketa 17, and Pacific 12.

Jean Sandwick again set the pace for the Cougars with her 5:41.3 mile win.

The Cougars then went on to dominate the 110 yd. high hurdles with a sweep by Barb Johnson, Verna Simon and Rhonda Giltz. They recorded times of 15.6, 16.5 and 16.8 respectively.

Debbie Leathers ran a 2:27.3 half mile and was followed to the tape by Tammy Likens.

Verna Simon turned in a 70.4 time in the intermediate hurdles, which brought her a victory and the mile relay team of Simon, Likens, Eggleston, and Leathers won first place honors with their 4:20 time.

The Cougars' next competition will be at the Mt. Hood relays this Friday night in Gresham.
