

## Petitions for graduation available in Admissions Office

Petitions for graduation are now being accepted at the admissions office.

Students completing their degree, certificate, GED, or adult

high school diploma may petition for graduation. The deadline to turn in petitions is May 5. There is no cost for graduation petitions.

Requirements for graduation in completing a degree are, completion of 93 credit hours, a cumulative GPA of 2.0, attend Clackamas at least two terms (including the last), and complete 24 credit hours at Clackamas.

Graduation requirements for completing a certificate are: attend Clackamas at least one term (including the last), complete 12 credit hours at Clackamas, and a cumulative GPA of 2.0.

Applications for those seeking offices are due Friday. The elections are scheduled to take place Thursday-Friday, April 27-28 in the Student Activities Office.
