CCC receives \$30,000 grant for new project

News Editor Clackamas Community Colege has received a \$30,000. manufacturing grant to develop a screw machine program.

According to Clackamas Community College Director of Business Development, Karen Stone, the Enoch Manufacturing Corporation of Clackamas will work with the college to develop a program which will teach students how to operate the equipment

The grant, which was given to CCC by The Oregon Economic Development Department, will be used for curriculum development and pay for the instructors, ac-cording to Kit Youngren, assistant de

This program is going to do two things: one, develop a program to train screw machine operators; and two, to provide in structional programs within the program," said Stone.

These classes will be offered

at a Wilsonville facility which the college will be moving in to in July. Clackamas Community College will lease the building to hold these classes.

"There will be two groups of people taking these classes: people who are working as machine screw operators and need retraining, and high school juniors and seniors who are learning the trade," said

There is currently a shortage of machine screw operators. hoped that this program will help to eliminate this shortage.

A screw machine is used to make small precision parts or screws. "Small precision parts are

needed for all high tech industries," said Stone.

People who take these five classes will register at Clackamas Community College. The instruc-tor is going to be Mark Schimidt. The primary goal of this
