It has been a successful season for the Cougar's men and women's cross country teams so far. Their accomplishments range from defeating top 10 four year colleges, to winning invitational's and divisions.

The men's team stands tall with a very respectable 33-4 record, while the women's team is also doing well with a 21-15 record. The records are not as impressive as the schools they competed against. They have been competing mostly with four-year colleges and universities

which have juniors and seniors. CCC has only freshman and sophomores.

The men's team has not lost to a community college, with three of their four losses coming against top 10 four-year schools. They also have defeated George Fox and Eastern Oregon State, which are top 10 universities.

Of the women's teams 15 losses eight have been at the

hands of top 10 four year colleges and universities. They have defeated Southern Oregon State which is a top 10 university.

The men are the three time Northwest Champions winning the championship in 1991, 92, and 93, and things are looking good for the rest of the season. The women finished third last season but were champions from 1990 to 1992.

"This is the best women's team here at Clackamas since 1978," said Hodges of the women's cross country team.

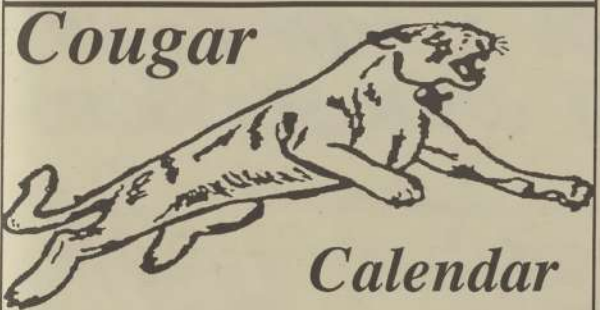
So far the men and women both have two first place trophies under their belts and they have won the Community College Division, and the Clackamas Invitational.

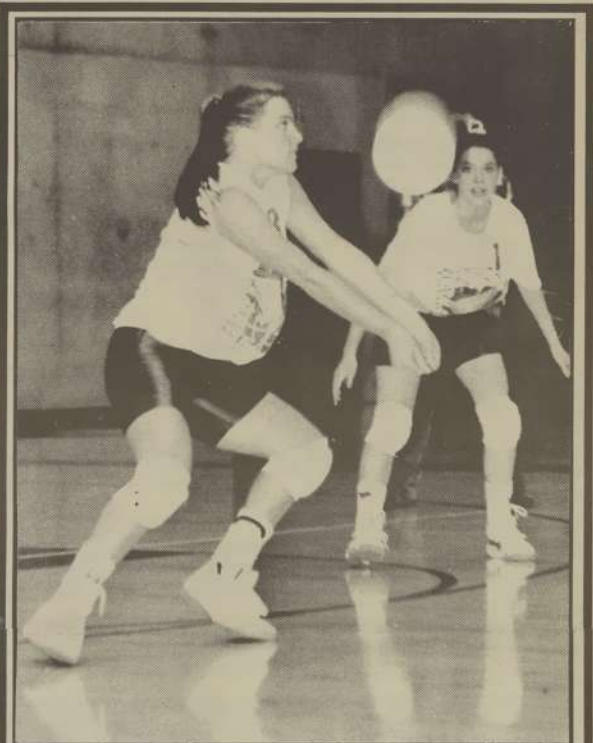
