a) increase recruitment of minority candidates for all college positions

b) research techniques used by other colleges to recruit minority staff

* Encourage and recognize bilingual and sign language skills of existing staff (develop a campus directory).

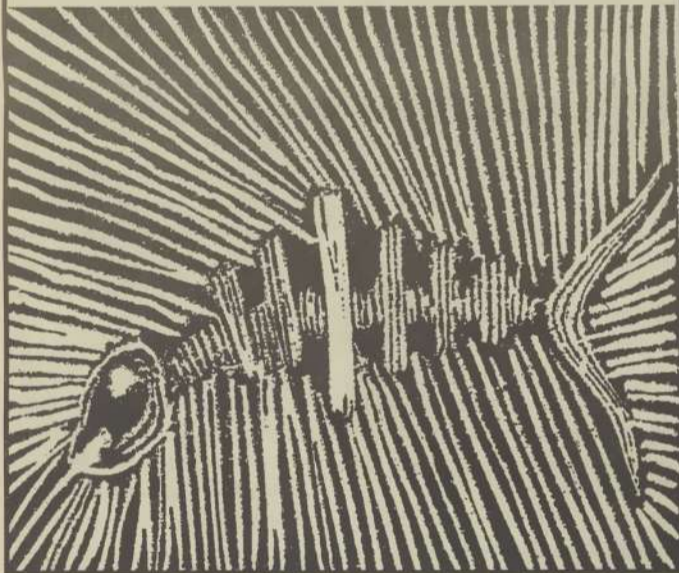
* Provide increased opportunities for staff diversity training.
