

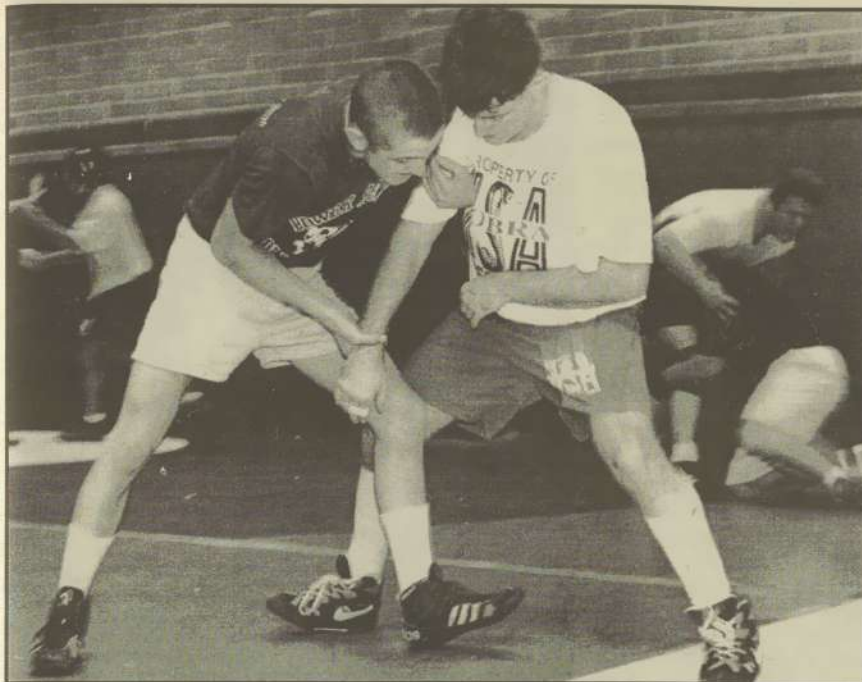

Hawks look to capture division

The Portland Winter Hawks just successfully completed what may have been the most important weekend of the season.

With only four points separating the Hawks and the second-place Seattle Thunderbirds, the Hawks came to play Saturday night. They dominated the Thunderbirds by a score of 7-2 in a sold out Memorial Coliseum, stretching their lead to six points.

On Sunday the Hawks faced the fourth-place Prince George Cougars, who they had been unable to beat in their last three meetings and they hung on to win 4-3.

This weekend was a great accomplishment for the injury-ridden Hawks, who are still without forwards Brad Isbister and Chris Jacobson. Both will be key players in the playoff race and are expected back within the next two weeks.

The Hawks "magic number" that will secure them a first-place finish in the Western Division now stands at 12. This means any Port-

land win coupled with a Seattle loss will lessen the number by two. A Portland win and a Seattle win will lessen the number by one.

Having been in first place for close to three months, the Hawks have just four weeks left to hang onto the title. A first-place birth in the playoffs will secure the Hawks home-ice advantage throughout the playoffs. They would meet the sixth-place finisher in the first round, and have a second round bye, assuming they win in the first round.

In the next 35 days the Hawks will be playing 19 games including eight at home and four against

Seattle.

The Hawks next home game is Wednesday, Feb. 19 in Memorial Coliseum against the Moose Jaw Warriors.

The next I-5 rivalry will be Sunday, March 9 in the Coliseum. This could be a battle for first-place bragging rights.
